All of these students have contributed to making our school what it is. I thank them for this contribution.

In what was first for MUN, we also hosted an online MUN at the end of Term. We thank those students involved in this successful initiative, and Ms Sara for her undying enthusiasm and commitment to this initiative.

COVID-19 has also brought changes to the ways that companies are doing business, and this has impacted directly on the school community. 



Specifically, I am proud of our Debating teams that were awarded with the 2nd place in Doha for their





Maths Week and Inter Newton Maths Competition


A SPARK OF SCIENCE





INNOVATION CAMP






DUKE OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD
