Year Five with amazing writing!

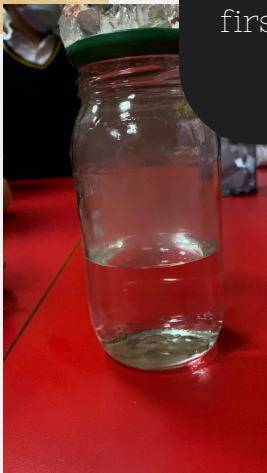
