On Monday each year group went outside to complete multiple footballing challenges including penalties, throw ins and dribbling. On Tuesday pupils participated in a school wide World Cup quiz with questions devised by Mr. Ward with some help from our Head Boy and Deputy Head Boy, Sami and Mina. 
In Mathematics, we have been busy learning all about 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. We enjoyed some practical lessons where; we had to draw our friends using only 3D shapes, we hunted for 2D and 3D shapes in the playground and in everyday objects. Thank goodness we are such good investigators! After studying shapes, we moved on to working with numbers up to 20 using tens and ones. We had lots of fun using the 'Base Ten' manipulatives to help us understand this topic.



In Science, we have been categorising animals and have learnt all about their different features and what they like to eat. This really helped us when we were writing our report about elephants! In Humanities, we learnt all about Sir David Attenborough. We found his life fascinating and his love for animals and the planet inspirational. He would have been extremely proud of us when we celebrated Sustainability Day!







We have enjoyed several celebrations as well this term. We particularly enjoyed 'FIFA World Cup Week' when we got to wear our favourite team's jersey, take part in World Cup themed quizzes and showcase our amazing football skills. #### **WHAT AN AMAZING LEARNING JOURNEY YEAR 2!**

Year 2 have been working hard over the term, whilst having fun along the way. In English we have been learning about reports and different features that are used when writing a report. Recently, we have been exploring and learning about Christopher Columbus!

Our T4W model text has also been about Columbus and his story. In maths we have recently been learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes, such as faces, vertices and edges. Students love this topic and are really enthusiastic to learn. In science we have been learning about animals and humans, we have also started to look at the human body, before and after exercising. The children love this topic and are very interested in the animal aspect







We have also celebrated World Cup Week, children had many different activities which included some football games outside, they all had such great fun playing and working together. We also had crazy hat and socks day, everyone including staff and children wore funky clothing and had so much fun! Children especially enjoyed Explorers Day; they searched the school for clues to find the treasure chest.

### **WHAT A FANTASTIC TERM WE HAVE HAD IN YEAR 3!**

In Science, we were learning all about plants. We planted seeds, looked at the parts of a plant, explored water transportation in plants and learnt all about seed dispersal. The children loved conducting experiments and are developing their awareness of how to conduct a 'fair test'. We were learning about Volcanoes in Humanities. Throughout this topic, we have used play dough to create models of the layers of the Earth, explored how Earth is made of tectonic plates, completed map work based on the location of volcanoes and have understood how volcanoes are formed.







We were able to work in groups to research Volcano Cumbre Vieja and used this to help us write our own newspaper report. We also learnt about writing a diary entry by learning 'The Diary of a Crayon'. The children had a lot of fun learning this model text and have been able to innovate it in a range of creative ways. Year 3, you have worked so hard during Term 1! We can't wait to see what you achieve next term!

#### AN AMAZING TERM OF LEARNING IN YEAR 4!





In Maths, we have been exploring methods of addition and subtraction before identifying multiplication facts. The children in Year 4 were given the opportunity to explore creating fact families using their understanding of commutative operations, the times tables and their relationships.

In English, Year 4 have been looking at discussion texts. We began by looking at our model text about whether The Terracotta Army should be destroyed, linking in to our humanities topic of the Shang Dynasty. We then used this model text by extracting the key features before imitating them in our very own guided write. The children were eventually given the





opportunity to research the reasons for or against the destruction of the army before planning, preparing and draft their own discussion text using the relevant features. These pieces of work turned out great and I'm sure there are many more discussions we can delve into! We have now begun and nearly finished our next topic of a suspense narrative.





In October, Year 4 took part in a range of different activity days in preparation for the Qatar 2022 World Cup. We also created some wonderful artwork for a FIFA World Cup themed competition. It was great to see the unity and enthusiasm displayed by both the staff and children throughout!

## **ANCIENT GREECE!**

On the 13th of October, we celebrated Ancient Greece day. The children came to school dressed in their wonderful Greek inspired outfits. The day started with Ms Foteini, a Greek teacher at our school, teaching us about her country. She taught us some Greek words and explained the meaning behind the Greek flag. During the day, the children got to create some Greek vase art, write their name in Greek, participate in our version of the Olympics and taste some delicious Greek food such as baklava, tzatziki and Greek yogurt.



Towards the end of October, we had the opportunity to celebrate the upcoming FIFA World Cup. It was a week full of fun activities and dress up. We participated in some sports activities outside, a World Cup quiz, a STEM challenge of building the perfect footballer and ended the week with a wacky sock and hat day!







In between all of these fun celebrations, we have been working diligently to learn all of our Year 5 curriculum work. In Talk for Writing, we have been focusing on our new topic of narrative myths – linking with our Ancient Greek theme in Humanities. Our model text, Pandora's box, is the mythical explanation of how all evil and hope was released into our world. During Mathematics, we have been challenging ourselves with the topic of fractions. We have looked at different types of fractions, how to order and compare them and how to convert between different type of fractions. It has been such an interesting term so far, and we can hardly believe how fast the time has gone! Good luck to all the teams participating in the World Cup and we look forward to a productive, successful second term.


# WHAT A MAGNIFICENT HALF TERM IN YEAR 6!
