Year 1 have really enjoyed the first half of Term 1! We have learnt about lots of exciting topics.

We celebrated 'Roald Dahl Day' and 'House Colour' Day this half term which was great fun!

In Math's, we have learnt all about number bonds, fact families and addition. We even drew our own part-whole models and used cubes to represent different amounts.





In English, we learnt all about the features needed to write a story. We learnt the story of Officer Ben and had lots of fun coming up with actions to help us remember the words to our story. When we had learnt all of this, we changed the characters and setting and created a whole new story and actions!

In Science, we learnt all about the five senses and enjoyed carrying out an experiment using corn kernels to make popcorn. It was very exciting and yummy! We have also been learning about the human body and have even moved on to learning about animal body parts. In Humanities, we learnt all about our local landmarks and enjoyed talking about which ones we have visited. We also learnt about different types of housing and found it interesting to see what kind of houses our friends live in.

A SUPER START TO YEAR 2!

A big well done to all of the Year 2 children who have been working so hard this term. In Maths we have been learning about place value and addition and subtraction. We have enjoyed some practical lessons such as comparing numbers and a counting in 5's scavenger hunt. In English we have just started our new topic learning how to write a Non-Chronological report. Our T4W model text is about a polar bear and much to the children's surprise we had a polar bear called Snowy visit the teachers in Year 2.



In science we have been learning about habitats. The children have enjoyed creating posters about animal habitats and making their own bug hotels. We have also celebrated our first house colours day and international reading day. We learnt about the very famous author Roald Dahl, looking at some of his work including stories and poems.



There have been some fantastic projects History of Qatar projects handed in and the children have shown that they have developed an understanding of the components of a neighbourhood. Keep up the amazing work Year 2!

SOME ROCKING LEARNING YEAR 3. GREAT WORK!

What a busy but exciting start to the year we have had in Year 3! We were learning all about the Stone Age in Humanities. Throughout this topic, we have visited our own cave, created cave paintings and clay models of Stone Henge and we even had our own dress up Stone Age day! This linked to our English T4W story, The Stone Age Boy, where we looked at the features of a narrative text and then wrote our own version.





In Maths, we have been learning all about place value and we have done a lot of practical work with our Base 10. In Science, we learnt about 'Rocks, Fossils and Soil'. We learnt all about the process of fossilisation and made our own clay fossils. We used Oreo's, M&Ms, biscuits and coconut flakes to explore and understand the different layers of soil. What a fantastic start to Year 3- keep up the great work!

AMAZING OUTDOOR LEARNING YEAR 4! GREAT WORK!

In Year 4, we have been looking at Living things and their habitats. As part of their learning, Year 4 were able to go out and look out for habitats in our very own West Bay! They really enjoyed seeking out the animals and trying to identify how they have adapted to suit their environment. Animals and, more specifically, animals in the rainforest have also been explored in our humanities topic of Brazil. The children were fully immersed in creating their own pieces of art inspired by the rainforest.







In Maths, we began by looking at place value and how numbers are organised. After consolidating the foundational topic of place value, Year 4 were able to add and subtract 1s, 10s, 100s and 1000s. We were also able to identify a range of ways to add and subtract numbers up to 4-digits, exchanging where necessary.

In English, we have been looking at narratives. We began by looking at our model text about a journey in the rainforest. We then utilised this model text by extracting the key features before imitating them in our very own guided write. Next. the children planned and drafted their own narrative using the correct features. The stories they wrote were great and I'm sure there are many future authors among us! We have now begun our next topic of discussion texts, where we will be able to explore writing different sides of an argument.

LETS GO YEAR 5! GREAT LEARNING THIS HALF TERM!

What an exciting start it has been to the 2022-2023 academic year! The new Year 5 group have settled in well and are all enjoying the new challenges of the Year 5 curriculum. There have been some positive changes, such as going back to the library more regularly as a class and the children being able to enjoy outdoor breaks again

During English, we have finished our talk for writing unit on the extremely, interesting creature called the Rhiswanozebtah. Our new unit is on poetry and we have been learning all the literacy devices in poems; our favourite fabulous feature is alliteration.





In Science, we have been learning various life cycles. A highlight was getting the chance to dissect a lily in class and see all the parts we had been learning about. In Humanities, we started off with the water cycle before moving on to learning about rivers and mountains. A few weeks ago, we were fortunate enough to have a Year 5 assembly in the gym. We spoke about our value of responsibility. It has been a great start to the year and we are very excited for what is still to come!







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


ARRIBA! AN EXCELLENT START TO THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR! WELL DONE YEAR 6!

In Mathematics, we were focusing on place value and four operations, we created our music videos to help us memorise the steps for long division.

In Science, Year 6 have been learning about animals and their environments including food chains and classifying plants and animals.





Mexico is our topic in Humanities which meant we could celebrate Mexican Independance day which was held on 16th September. To celebrate, some classes had Mexican day where they could bring in a cactus and some mexican traditional foods to taste.

Finally, in Art, we were learning all about portraits including how to proportion the face, show our interests in split portraits and layered portraits.
