




In Mathematics, we began the term by looking at mass, capacity, and temperature. During our lessons we did a lot of practical learning both inside the classroom and out in the science lab. We used scales to compare the weight of classroom items as well as using different containers and rice to compare different capacities over in the lab. Towards the end of the term, we moved onto looking at fractions, using a wide range of resources to help us gain a good understanding of the topic.

In English, we were introduced to a story of a lost penguin and a boy who really wanted to help. To help us understand how the penguin felt, we brought our own teddies into school. Unfortunately, our teddies got lost around the school. We spoke as classes about how our teddies may be feeling and what we could do to make them feel better. This story has introduced us to lots of new vocabulary and we have taken more time to look at inverted commas and expanded noun phrases.

During our science topic, we have been looking at plants. To start our topic, we went on a learning walk around the school, looking for different plants and flowers. We studied the different flowers we found, drawing a detailed picture of what we found and labelling each part. After this, we planted cress seeds and placed them in different environments to see how that would affect their growth. We have been keeping a record of how our plants have been growing and how they compare to the others.











We are proud of all the pupils as they have shown great resilience during Ramadan. We have really enjoyed listening to the pupils celebrate their religion and we had a wonderful time celebrating Garangao with the pupils and the Arabic staff. As well as this, the pupils have shown a great attitude for learning throughout our shortened days and timetable. Thank you for your continued support throughout the year, enjoy your break and we look forward to seeing you back for the end of term 3!










What a start we have had to term 3 as the weather starts to heat up! In Science, we were learning all about forces and magnets. First, we looked at the difference between push and pull and the effects that they have on objects before paying a visit to the Science lab to conduct an experiment about how far toy cars can travel on different surfaces. Then, we learned about magnets and what effect they have on different objects as well as each other. The children really enjoyed using magnets to explore how opposite poles attract and the same poles repel each other! In Humanities we have been learning about Ancient Egypt. First, we used an atlas to compare Ancient Egypt to modern day Egypt and discussed the reasons the borders have changed over time. Then, we learned about the pivotal role the River Nile played in Ancient Egyptian life before discovering the steps involved in mummification!













In Maths we have been exploring the topics of mass and capacity. The children have learnt how to identify mass and capacity, some of the tools used for this and how to add and subtract between grams and kilograms, as well as millilitres and litres. We have been doing plenty of practice on word problems in Maths and have recently started our new topic of fractions. We have learnt about writing a persuasive piece by investigating a travel brochure for visiting Egypt. The children had a lot of fun discussing this model text and have been able to innovate it with lots of amazing features, including rhetorical questions, alliterations and expanded noun phrases to create some spectacular writing pieces!










Year 4 have been actively engaged in hands-on activities and engaging lessons that have brought the study of decimals to life. We have discovered how to represent decimal numbers in different ways, such as through pictorial representations and manipulatives. Additionally, we have honed their skills in comparing and ordering decimals, understanding the relationship between fractions and decimals, and identifying the place value of digits in decimal numbers.









In science, we have been exploring the fascinating world of circuits. Over the course of this unit, students have learned about the components that make up a circuit, as well as sources of electricity and the properties of conductors and insulators. The highlight of the unit was the opportunity for students to get handson experience with real circuits, allowing them to build and test their own circuits and see the principles they had learned in action. Through this immersive learning experience, Year 4 students have developed a deeper understanding of electricity and circuits and have developed skills in experimentation and problem-solving. We are proud of their hard work and dedication to science and look forward to seeing where their curiosity will take them next.

We have been diving into the captivating world of history and technology over time in Humanities. During this unit, we explored various forms of technology and how they have transformed over the years, from the invention of the wheel to modern-day devices such as cars, planes, and phones. By examining the development of technology over time, students gained a better understanding of its impact on society and the world around us. Through hands-on activities and thought-provoking discussions, we have developed a deep appreciation for the role of technology in shaping our world and are now better equipped to be informed and engaged citizens in the digital age.

The start of Term 3 was quiet, focusing on the holy month of Ramadan. The children have been hard at work, continuing their lessons and learning in the last few months of Year 5. Half way through Ramadan, we celebrated Garangao. The Year 5's received many sweets and enjoyed sharing them with their friends.

In English this month, we have been looking at a Mystery and Suspense narrative text. The children had a lot of fun doing actions and learning our text - Kidnapped. After having a closer look at personification, similes and ellipses, we were ready to complete our hot write!

Maths contained a few engaging topics and we got a chance to measure angles with protractors. It was exciting learning about new 2D and 3D shapes and their specific properties. We also had a chance to plot coordinates and translate shapes on a graph. The last topic of this term, we circled back to decimals and we are working on adding and subtracting decimals.

The topic, properties of materials in Science, has been full of experiments and testing. It is a hands-on topic and the children have been loving it! We have tested the temperature of water when surrounded by different insulators and watched salt dissolved in water and then watched the water evaporate again. We have looked at the three states of matter and different properties that everyday materials have.





Humanities has been focused on the history of the Anglo-Saxons. Children had the opportunity to hot-seat Alfred the Great and ask him a few questions on Danelaw and his agreement with the Vikings. We looked at the two different battles that took place, which caused the end of both the Vikings and Anglo-Saxon era in Britain.

We are looking forward to the next and last half term of the year! We have an exciting trip planned to Snow Dunes, a LEGO STEM day, Anglo-Saxon day and Science week. It is going to be busy, but we are going to love every second of it!






In Mathematics, we have enjoyed learning about fractions, decimals and percentages in our classes. Having streamed our Mathematics classes, we have gained some valuable experience about how school life will be in Year 7! We have learned to take accountability for our belongings as we move from class to class and learned about the exciting opportunity of having many teachers. We began a new topic -Statistics - which will allow us to explore pie charts, line graphs and bar graphs to present information and handle data.











In Humanities, we enjoyed our hands-on approach to teaching trade. Outside, we lead a pupil-led lesson whereby we had to trade using PE equipment. This allowed us to explore concepts such as tax, tariffs, imports, exports, mergers and much more! During our Humanities lessons about globalisation, we used our critical thinking skills to evaluate the impact that globalisation has on our own lives and how our own lives have been impacted in a positive way - including where our foods come from and how much variety we have! We are looking forward to studying the history of trade during the Term.
