#### **WHAT A MATHEMATICAL WEEK!**



There were so many different maths activities happening throughout the week in every year group. Each day started with a morning maths challenge, these were available to all pupils as they entered school in the morning. Year 6 had their own additional daily maths challenges to complete as well. Children who worked out the correct answer had their name put into a random drawing to decide the winners of some sweet treats.









Children took part in a maths scanvenger hunt, for this they had to find a series of maths problems. To find the next clue that had to correctly answer the previous maths problems. Children also took part in a maths quiz, they split into teams in their classes and took on the mathematical challenge. They had lots of fun competing against each other to see who would come out of top.

The week concluded with a STEM challenge. Everyone was tasked to use their mathematical knowledge to complete a challenge. In KS1, pupils were asked to build the tallest tower using straws. In Year 3 and 4, pupils has to create the tallest structure using spaghetti and marshmallows. In Year 5 and 6, pupils had to create the tallest structure from paper block shapes and also build the strongest bridge using just two plastic cups and one piece of paper.



This month has been fantastic here in Year One. We firstly went on our school trip, were we got to meet lots of animals, go digging, race each other on bikes and so much more. This month saw a lot of hard working boys and girls. In Art the children created beautiful sea sculptures and we also learnt all about water colours. We were very creative. In Humanities we have focused on all the oceans of the world and we have looked at old toys and new toys. While in Science we have been working on our planting skills by planting our very own sunflower seeds. Year One have also learnt the differences between deciduous and ever green trees and recognising the different leaves! We went on a scavenger hunt around the school to learn all about different trees. It was a lot of fun! In English we have worked hard at our story writing skills and how to include sentence starters, nouns, adjectives and time connectives in our writing. In Mathematics we have focused on length, mass, volume and height! The children have measured plenty of things around our classroom! This month has been wonderful, and we have had lots of fun while working and studying hard!

Year 2 enjoyed our school Maths Week, which was fuelled by fun filled activities and brain teasers. In Mathematics, Year 2 have finished off their multiplication and division topic of the 2, 5 and 10-times tables and began their new topic of measurement. Pupils have made sound progress as well as had a lot of fun measuring the length and height of various objects inside and out of the classroom. They can now differentiate the units of measurement - centimetres (cm) and metres (m).

In English, Year 2 have been focusing on an instructional text. The pupils learned the importance of time connectives, imperative verbs and adverbs when giving instructions. The opportunity to make rice crispy, chocolate cookies sparked their excitement and this only emphasised the need for clear and concise instructions, when they realised that poor instructions would lead to a bad batch of cookies.

In Science, Year 2 changed their focus from 'Everyday Materials' to 'Changing Materials'. The unit of learning embedded children's knowledge of material properties whilst introducing how materials can change from one state to another through the effects of temperature or by force. This topic allowed children to access and experience a wide variety of scientific experiments and terminology. For example, pupils learned about freezing, melting, evaporation, condensation, elasticity, reversible and irreversible changes.

In Humanities, Year 2 began to turn their attention to human geographical features and physical geographical features by comparing London and Doha. Art linked well with this topic as pupils created pieces of work focusing on the Doha skyline and man-made buildings that can be found in London.

Term 2 has continued to be jam-packed with exciting activities! In Science, we completed our learning all about Animals and Humans. We looked at how all our bones are connected by muscles and how these muscles work in order for us to move. We focused on the Romans in Humanities. We looked at the Empire and how it was built up over the years, what the Romans wore and ate and the two levels of society, the Plebeians and the Nobles. We did a few interesting research activities and learnt about Queen Boudica, the Celtic heroine. We discovered the influence the Romans had on Britain.





In maths we have been exploring length and perimeter, measuring in mm, cm and m. We also learnt how to work out the perimeter of a shape. The children explored fractions through a few practical lessons. They looked at unit fractions and discovered how to compare these. We then moved on to non-unit fractions and divided shapes, counted in fractions on the number line and worked out equivalent fractions. The writing genre was how to write a twisted tale. The children had fun changing fairy tales into twisted tales. Through this topic the children learnt to write in paragraphs.

This half term has also seen us celebrating National Sports Day with a sports day at school. The children loved competing in various fun sporting activities, including obstacle races, relays and many more. Year 3 also went on their first School Trip. The children were very excited to go to Baladna Farm. We got to see the cows being milked and fed the many animals they had for us to observe. After a short break they were able to enjoy some fun activities like boating and climbing on the activity apparatus. We're all looking forward to a well-earned short break!


Year 4 students have been delving into the complex world of fractions as part of their math curriculum. They have gained a solid understanding of parts of a whole, identifying equivalent fractions, and have even mastered the concept of mixed numbers. They have been challenged with subtracting from whole amounts and converting improper fractions to mixed numbers.



In their English, students took on the exciting challenge of learning about newspaper reports. They learned to distinguish between facts and opinions and developed the skills to identify and write engaging headlines. Through research and investigation, they honed their writing skills and gained a deeper understanding of how news is reported. Their final piece was on a mystery teacher trashing the Year 4 villa! Their final newspaper articles were a testament to their hard work and dedication.







Scientists have long studied the different states of matter, but, this month, Year 4 students have been getting in on the action too! Through hands-on experiments and engaging classroom activities, they explored the properties of each state of matter and discovering how they can change from one state to another. They have also been discovering the amazing journey that water takes as it moves from the ground to the sky and back again. T

In humanities, they have been exploring the fascinating country of Russia. They have learned about Russia's vast size, varied landscapes, and diverse culture. They have learned about the unique geography and climate of Siberia, which is known for its bitterly cold winters and vast expanses of untouched wilderness. Year 4 have studied the traditional way of life of the indigenous people who have lived in this region for centuries.








In English, we had great fun writing our warning tales. We saw some great innovation, linking it to our previous topic - World War Two. During English, we focused on using passive voice, boundaries between clauses and hyphens! During our weekly short-bursts, we learned to apply these skills which resulted in some lovely writing pieces.

During our guided reading sessions, we continued with our novel - Hot Money! We were able to use this text to discuss some of our monthly values. For example - Rule of Law. This novel spearheaded some fruitful discussion about choosing right from wrong and encouraged us to show empathy - what would we do if we were in August and Miles' situation?





During Mathematics, we have enjoyed learning about decimals and percentages. This allowed us to explore concepts such as profit and loss. During our streamed sessions, we introduced our Responsibility Records in our planners. This will teach us responsibility and prepare us for Year 7 as we learn to have quick transitions between classes, be prepared and on time as well as getting used to new teachers.! What great practice!

In Science, our topic - Light - lended itself to some interesting practical lessons. We used torches and mirrors to investigate how light bounces off flat, shiny objects and applied this knowledge in creating and exploring periscopes. During our lessons, we discussed how rainbows and other phenomena are formed when light travels through a prism!

Our humanities topic allowed us to reflect on how we, as global citizens, have a responsibility to look after our environment as we explored issues such as climate change and deforestation. We practiced our reasoning and decision-making skills during our geography topic including comparing and contrasting biomes.
