To celebrate and promote the reading culture within the school the English faculty with the aid of Ms. Edith, the school librarian, organised a week of exciting activities and events all connected to books.







Everyone has worked very hard and have started the new year with lots of eagerness and enthusiasm. We have had a busy term filled with exciting events, lots of hard work and learning.

In English, we learnt all about instructional writing. We kicked off the learning this term by going on a mysterious treasure hunt using a map that the pirates had left in Ms Mari's post! We worked hard as a team to follow the instructions on the map and we followed the golden coins, which led us all to a delicious treat! This fun activity helped us to learn how to write instructions using all the key features that we have been learning about, such as time connectives and bossy verbs.







In Mathematics, we continued to learn about the "Base Ten" as well as counting on from ten using number lines, counters and ten frames. We really enjoyed these practical lessons as they helped us see the different ways that we can use to count on, add and subtract! We also learnt about doubles and near doubles as well as learning about the different number bonds to 20. It's been a great term learning about all these topics and we look forward to learning some more about these topics again soon!

In Science, we had a great time looking at materials and their properties. We enjoyed the different experiments, looking at different objects, categorising them in terms of materials and properties. We enjoyed making predictions about whether some objects were waterproof or absorbent and it was interesting to see the movements of the toy vehicles on surfaces with different materials. This really helped us understand how materials and their properties differed from each other.









In Humanities, we learnt all about the seven continents. Our favourite thing to do this term was to sing the song about the seven continents which really helped us remember their names! We also enjoyed going on missions on our pirate ships from continent to continent, learning all about them and their famous landmarks as well as the different animals that live there. What an exciting journey it's been!

WHAT A GREAT TERM IT HAS BEEN IN YEAR 2 SO FAR!







In Maths we have been learning about money and how to make different amounts using coins and notes. We could identify different coins and notes and compare them according to their value. Recently we have started to use arrays to create multiplication and repeated addition number sentences.















In English we have been learning the story of the Great Fire of London and we created our own versions of the Toby and the Great Fire of London story using new characters and disasters. We learnt how to use adverbs, speech marks and adjectives to make our writing more creative and imaginative. In Science we learnt about materials and their properties. We described different materials and thought about their use. We conducted some investigations into different materials. One of our investigations was about what materials we could use to protect an egg when it is dropped from a height. Our second investigation was our fire experiment, which was fantastic! We watched the houses we made from different materials burn and we observed how fast the material we chose burnt. Then we reflected on the experiment and identified which materials are flammable and which are non-flammable. The fire experiment was also linked to our learning in Humanities where we learnt about the story and the people in the Great Fire of London in Stuart times.

We have had great special days this term! First, we had Arabic week and we shared food and wore our traditional costumes. Then, during the international week we learnt about different countries in South America, like Argentina, shared international food and wore our traditional costumes. In the end, we presented information about the country of our choice in front of our class. We also went on a school trip to Baladna Farm which was amazing. Everybody had so much fun taking part in all the different activities.

WHAT AN EVENTFUL START TO TERM 2 FOR YEAR 3!



What a start we have had after the World Cup break! It has been an eventful month in Year 3 to say the least. In Science, we were learning all about Animals including Humans. First, we looked at the Eatwell plate and explored the different food groups in order to understand what makes a balanced diet and where our nutrition comes from. Then, we explored the skeletons of different animals and looked at the different types of skeletons. The children enjoyed looking at their model skeletons and singing head, shoulders, knees and toes with bones! We were learning about Italy in Humanities. First, we used an atlas to locate where it was on the map as well as looking at Italy's neighbouring countries. Then, we went on an exciting geography hunt to explore different physical features of famous mountains and rivers located in Italy.





















In Maths we have been exploring multiplication and division using flexible partitioning. The children have learnt how to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number with and without exchange. We even looked at dividing with remainders and have incorporated iPad lessons as well as lessons including representatives to deepen our understanding. We also learnt about writing a set of instructions by learning 'How to make a pizza.' The children had a lot of fun learning this model text and have been able to innovate it in a range of creative ways, including a hook lesson making and eating a real pizza!

A WONDERFUL START TO TERM TWO!






















In English, Year 4 have been looking at myths. We began by looking at our model text about the famous myth of Beowulf and Grendel, linking in to our humanities topic of the Vikings in Scandinavia. We created a story map based off the model text before proceeding to extract the features of the text ahead of planning our own. The children were then allowed to innovate and create a unique myth before planning, preparing and drafting their own myths using the features we extracted. These myths turned out to be so interesting to read!

In Science, this term, we have been focusing our learning on States of Matter. We explored the characteristics of the different states before identifying examples. We then looked at how states of matter may change before having the chance to complete many experiments and investigations upon this really interesting topic.

In Humanities, the Victorious Vikings were our focus for this term. We looked at how the Vikings lived day to day before immersing ourselves in their interesting history! Exploring their travel, trade and famous raids, we have had a lot of fun delving into their unique part of history.

A GREAT LEAP BACK INTO LEARNING YEAR 5!







Welcome back to all the Year 5's. We can hardly believe we are finished with the first month of Term 2. It has been an extremely busy term so far, celebrating three special weeks; Book week, Arabic week and International week!

During Book week, the children had the opportunity to visit Crescent Book store in Villa 6. We had a wonderful time wearing our pyjama's, in this unusually rainy weather we have been experiencing in Qatar. We used some of our art lessons to create our own, unique origami bookmarks.















International week also saw many activities taking place each day. We shared fantastic home-made food from our native countries, learnt more about North America in a carousel activity with each of the Year 5 teachers and got to dress up in traditional clothes.

In between all the fun, we are still hard at work focusing on new topics. It has been very interesting learning about the Victorians and their wicked classroom punishments! This month, in English, we have been looking at portal stories and how they can help us travel to significant historical events. We have looked at a few different forces in science lessons, trying different experiments to help us learn. The next month holds even more excitement with our Year 5 trip and National Sport's Day!

WHAT AN ACTION PACKED START TO THE TERM IN YEAR 6!















In English, we have been learning about Biographies. During this sequence, we have been focusing on formal language in SPAG. Interestingly, our model text was all about Greta Thunberg - an youth climate activist. Through this, we had discussion about our role as global citizens on how to be sustainable. We enjoyed interviewing our teachers to help us gather information to write their biography for our guided write! Finally, we researched our own celebrity using ipads for our hot write. In English Reading, we immersed ourselves in poetry and non-fiction texts.

In Mathematics, we introduced a new topic: Ratio. During the topic, we use multi-link cubes and counters to teacher us different concepts about Ratio as Fractions. We learned how to apply this to real-life situations including recipes and how to plan a school trip! Now, we have begun algebra and have been using new mathematical terms such as: expressions, equations and substitution!

In Science, we have been learning about electricity. We used our theory to make predictions about circuits - Would our designs work? First, we designed a circuit in our books and guessed if they would work based on what we learned. After that, we tested our hypothesis' in groups using bulbs, wires, motors and batteries. Then, we analyzed our results. Using balloons, we learned that Static electricity is caused by friction! Also, we created posters on how to stay safe using electricity. We also learned about persuasive writing techniques to persuade our readers to reduce electricity use - inspired by Greta Thunberg (Our English Writing Text).

Humanities was also fun! We have learned about the events leading up to World War Two, Evacuation and The Blitz. When learning about the Blitz, we were able to see a real life gas mask! During our Evacuation Dress-up Day, we created Anderson Shelters, wrote an old style diary entry from the perspective of a young child during the war, created Blitz paintings (where we learned to shade and use silhouettes). Finally, we enjoyed a quiz!.
