THIS TERM'S NEWS

The children have been getting used to their new school environment this term. They've done a great job; you should be proud of everything they've achieved.

In Phonics, we've been learning to recognise different sounds around us. We explored sounds from our bodies, musical instruments, and voices to understand how sounds can be different.

In Talk for Writing, we worked with the story Owl Babies. We started by getting the children excited with a 'hook', and then they practised retelling the story using actions and a story map. After our trip to the aquarium, we changed the story to Aquarium Animals. The children made up new actions to help tell the new version. We had a fun "under the sea" dress-up party to celebrate finishing the story.

In Maths, we've been singing number songs and starting to use words like 'more', 'less', 'full', and 'empty'. We learnt all about patterns, height, weight, capacity, matching and sorting.













The children went on their first trip to the aquarium. They watched a 4D movie to learn about Hamad Port and how it was built. After that, they explored the aquarium and saw many different sea animals. including jellyfish, starfish, snakes, a baby shark, and many types of fish. The children really enjoyed their first trip of the year.


The children also started their first Talk for Writing with the story Owl Babies. Before we began the story, the children found an owl's nest on the playground with 3 eggs inside. Each day, we went back to check if the eggs had cracked. The children's imagination and language skills were amazing as they came up with lots of ideas about why the nest was there and where the owls went when the eggs cracked. This got them excited about our story.

The children celebrated Book Week and Qatar National Day.

Next term, Foundation 1 classes will go on a school trip with Doha Bus Tour. We will also be visited by the Build a Bear company. The children will take part in Science Week, Sports Week and International Day. The school will host our annual School Fair Day, where you can participate in many different games and activities with your family. We will welcome the parents into our class where they can play with their children and see the many different ways we learn in Foundation 1.

THIS TERM'S NEWS

In Term 1, F2 have worked so hard within their Phonics learning. The children have been learning to recognise, read and write letter sounds. They have also been applying this in order to read and write simple words. It has been amazing to see their progress so far!

In Literacy, the children have been learning to retell the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. Their learning began when they found a letter left in their classroom, alongside a mystery breakfast table covered in porridge oats! Inspired by the story, the children have created artwork based on the characters and story settings and storymaps and have been labelling their drawings of bears. Each F2 class have also innovated the story using their own amazing ideas.

In Maths, the children have been focused on recognising, representing and comparing numbers to 5. They are also gaining an understanding of one more and one less with numbers to 5. They have also been learning about 2D shapes and have enjoyed continuing and creating simple repeated patterns.







SPECIAL EVENTS

F2 has had such an exciting first term in school. The children had lots of fun on their trip to Eataly, where they got hands-on experience making their own pizza. The children were so excited to wear their special apron and chef's hat and showed a lot of pride in themselves for creating their own pizza.

We also celebrated Book Week, during which F2 was thinking about the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. During Book Week, the children were excited to visit the Book Fair, have parent readers visit their class to read a story and also have KS2 students come to read books with them.

We also invited F2 parents to a Phonics Workshop in Term 1, where we shared information on what the children will be learning in class in Phonics and tips for parents on how to continue learning at home.




UPCOMING EVENTS

In Term 2, we are so excited to be taking F2 on a trip to Heenat Salma Farm, where the children will be able to take part in lots of hands-on experiences and learn all about a working farm. The date of the trip will be confirmed in Term 2.

As a whole school, we will also celebrate Science Week, Sports Week and International Day in Term 2.

The F2 teachers will hold a Parent Workshop based on Guided Reading in F2. This will be an excellent opportunity to understand how to support reading at home and show parents examples of classroom activities and questions to support comprehension skills.

F2 Teachers will also hold Parent — Teacher meetings on January 13th and 14th of January. This is an excellent opportunity to discuss your child's next steps in their learning.









In English this Term, we have focused on writing a story. The children learnt the actions of "The Little Red Hen" and worked hard to remember the story. We then practised tricky words and began writing the story. Some of the children managed to innovate the story as a whole class and changed the characters and setting. We used adjectives in our writing and focused on describing our characters. In Mathematics, Year 1 has worked very hard on recognising numbers up to 20. We practised forming and writing these in numbers and words. Year 1 worked well on recognising numbers before and after. We then used our number lines to recognise how to add and subtract numbers to 20. Using the part-whole model, Year 1 could visualise how we can add and subtract the numbers to find a total. In History, we have been learning all about "The First Moon Landing". Year 1 enjoyed learning about Neil Armstrong and the Apollo 11 mission. In Science, we have been focusing on "Animals Including Humans". We discussed the 5 senses and how we use our senses in our daily lives.

SPECIAL EVENTS

This term, we have had many special days. We started the term with an inspiring Book Week, during which the children took part in many activities; we had buddy reading, and Year 6 children came and read with our classes. We had a fantastic bedtime story — pyjama day, where the children got to wear the pyjamas to school and bring a teddy and blanket. We read lots of stories and celebrated the importance of reading at home daily. The children were very excited and loved reading books. Please keep encouraging your child to read at home daily. We also had a very successful trip to KidzMondo, where the children got to work as teams and do jobs to earn money. Year 1 really enjoyed this and learnt some fabulous new skills. We ended the term with a very enjoyable "Space Day", where the children got to dress up in space-themed outfits. Year 1 participated in rotation activities where they read space books, created rockets using 2D shapes, explored magnets by creating space rockets, and used playdough to create what they found in space.

Next Term, we look forward to many exciting and fun new lessons and events. In Term 2, we will have an enjoyable Science Week, during which the children will focus on the importance of Science and how we use it in our daily lives. We will also have another enjoyable trip to Oli Oli Museum, where the children will explore and participate in fun scientific activities. We will look at instruction writing and why we use instructions in English. In Maths we will be moving on to numbers to 50. We will also be looking at length, height, weight and volume. In Science, we will be looking at plants and understanding how a plant grows. Geography, we will focus on continents and oceans, which is always an enjoyable topic for Year 1. We look forward to all our new learning and fun events in Term 2!

THIS TERM'S NEWS

Year

Year 2 has been working extremely hard in English this term. Before the midterm, they learnt how to write a narrative tale focusing on character description. They then learnt how to write a diary entry about Christopher Columbus. Some children were even successful in inventing their own diary entries all about their school trip this term to Carluccio's kid's cooking class! Year 2 continues to work hard with their phonics; it's been great to see so many of them progress and fall in love with reading.

In Mathematics, Year 2 has learnt all about place value and how to add and subtract numbers. We now know all the different ways we can partition numbers! Year 2 also knows how to recognise and add equal groups in our multiplication topic. To make our learning more fun, we have taken part in a range of practical activities relating to multiplication, such as making arrays and equal groups with cubes and candy.

SPECIAL EVENTS

In Term 1, we celebrated Book Week at NBS Al Waab. The children loved learning about Little Red Riding Hood; we participated in various practical and written activities related to the story. This strengthened our knowledge of narrative tales, which we then used in our writing exam. We particularly enjoyed pyjama day, where we got to listen to bedtime stories and eat popcorn by the fire. KS2 also visited our children to help them read while wearing the reading glasses we designed in class.

Year 2 had their first school trip to Carluccio's in the Pearl for a kids' cooking class. We got to pretend to be Chefs for the day, wearing a chef's hat and apron. The head chef showed us how to make pizzas by following his step-by-step instructions. We then got to eat the pizzas with ice cream; they were so yummy.



UPCOMING EVENTS

Year 2 will begin the new year off positively as they will have their school trip in January. They will explore Doha and its beautiful buildings on the hop-on, hop-off bus. This will link to our topic of locational knowledge and Qatar Values.



SPECIAL EVENTS

Upcoming learning in English will include writing a letter and rhyming poetry. In Mathematics, Year 2 will learn about 2D and 3D shapes, British money and statistics. In Science, we will learn how seeds and bulbs grow into plants and what plants need to survive.


















SPECIAL EVENTS





This term, with the help of our amazing TAs, we have been working on exploring our loud, soft, fast and slow sounds using many different instruments, including drums and shakers

KS1

Year 1 students have been exploring the concept of beat by using shakers. Through interactive games, they are developing a steady sense of pulse and learning to play together in time. Meanwhile, Year 2 students are diving into rhythm, experimenting with patterns and different tempos. They've also begun using boomwhackers to create their own rhythmic sequences, combining fun and creativity. These activities build foundational musical skills in an engaging and collaborative environment!





KS2

Year 3 students have been exploring ostinatos, creating and performing repeated patterns to enhance their understanding of musical structure. Year 4 students have focused on dynamic changes, learning how variations in volume add emotion and interest to music. Meanwhile, Years 5 and 6 have been diving into major and minor keys, discovering how they affect mood and tone. Through hands-on activities and performances, all year groups are developing key musical skills and creativity!







SPECIAL EVENTS

This Book Week, children across the school have been bringing stories to life through music! Key Stage 1 immersed themselves in Little Red Riding Hood, using percussion instruments and body sounds. They explored how music can represent characters and build suspense.

Meanwhile, Key Stage 2 took inspiration from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, composing and performing vibrant theme songs to capture its whimsy and adventure. Their imaginative melodies showcased teamwork, communication and musical flair. It was an unforgettable celebration of storytelling and sound!





UPCOMING EVENTS

Next term promises to be full of musical fun and creativity across all year groups! Key Stage 1 children will have the chance to explore different instruments, experimenting with sounds and rhythms to tell stories and bring their ideas to life. They will learn to play expressively, work as a team, and create exciting musical pieces.

Years 3 and 4 will focus on listening to music by famous composers, discovering what makes their work special. They will explore how these composers use techniques like repetition, dynamics, and rhythm to make their music interesting. Inspired by what they hear, children will use these ideas to compose their own songs, building their creativity and understanding of music.

Years 5 and 6 will focus on writing original melodies and learning about musical notation. They will develop their ability to read and write music notes while exploring how melodies can express moods and emotions.





This term, PE has been engaging and educational. KS1 began by learning about sun protection and the importance of warm-ups and cool-downs, while KS2 explored these in more depth, emphasising their role in preventing injuries and improving performance. KS2 also studied the food pyramid, highlighting the benefits of a balanced diet for athletes and students.

Next, we focused on catching and throwing. KS1 worked on improving these fundamental skills through activities with various sports balls, including aiming at targets. KS2 advanced these skills by applying them in games, such as handball variations, which fostered teamwork and strategy.

The term ended with football. KS1 practised dribbling and passing using the inside of the foot, while KS2 applied these fundamentals in game situations, focusing on passing, dribbling, shooting, and understanding the rules of the game. It's been a fantastic term of learning and growth.

Across both key stages, students demonstrated great enthusiasm, teamwork, and progress, making it a fantastic term for Physical Education at Al Waab.
