Term 2 has been an extremely busy and successful period across Secondary at NIA. We were proud to celebrate our KS3 Top Achievers, with 90 students recognised for achieving grade 6 or above across 12 or 13 subjects, reflecting outstanding dedication and perseverance.

Beyond the classroom, our students represented the school with pride across numerous sporting competitions including basketball, volleyball, athletics, badminton, tennis, swimming, karate, and gymnastics. Students achieved excellent results, including podium finishes, tournament victories, and qualification for finals across several QSOP events. 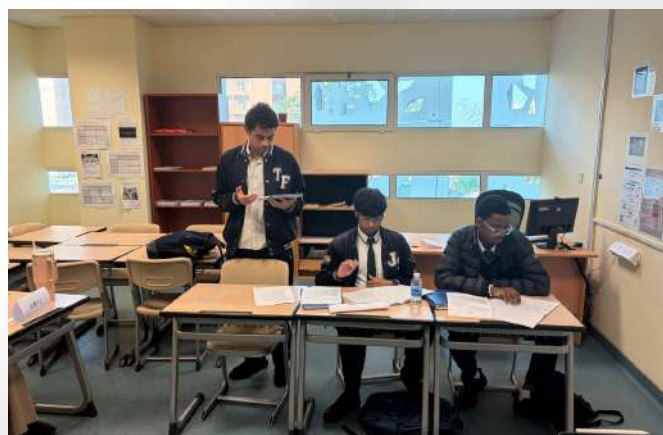

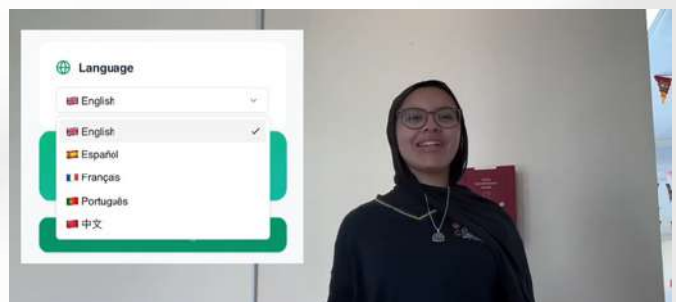


BUSINESS, ECONOMICS, TRAVEL & TOURISM AND ENTERPRISE

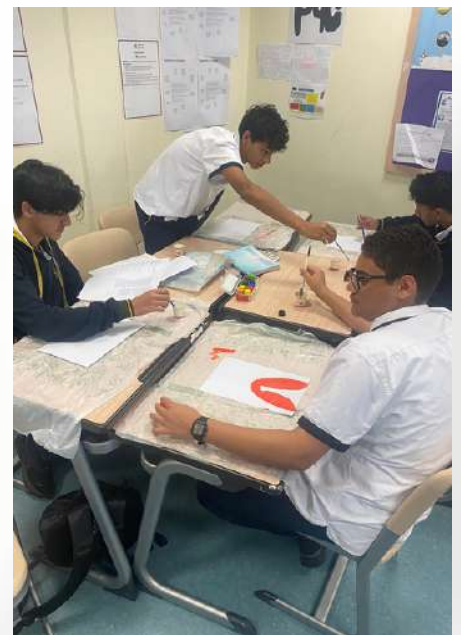
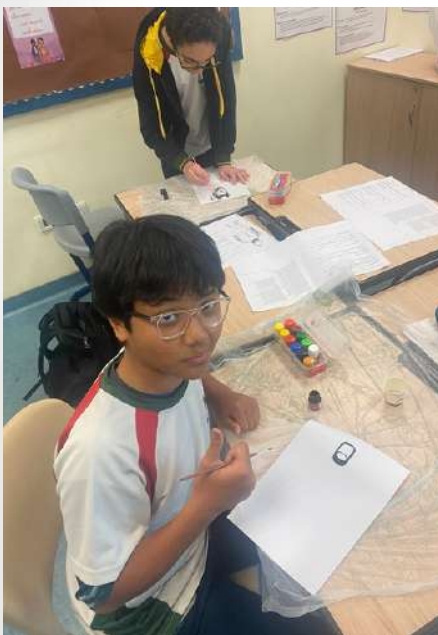
Our young musicians are also rehearsing for a musical performance for parents, and it has been encouraging to see their dedication and teamwork as they prepare.

CELEBRATING FRENCH CULTURE AT SCHOOL

In January, our students explored the French cultural tradition of La Galette des Rois. As part of their language learning journey, they discovered how this tradition is celebrated in France and other French-speaking countries. Students enjoyed sharing the famous galette des rois, and the lucky student who found the “fève” hidden inside became the king or queen for the day.



In February, students learned about La Chandeleur, a well-known cultural tradition in France. They explored its historical background and took part in making and tasting crêpes together.

These activities were presented as part of our commitment to cultural education and global awareness. They reflect our CIS values by promoting respect for different cultures, curiosity in learning, and community spirit. Through such experiences, students broaden their understanding of the world while strengthening their French language skills.

HUMANITIES OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

Humanities students recently took their learning beyond the classroom through a series of engaging educational visits linked to their studies in Geography and History. These experiences allowed students to explore key topics in greater depth and see how the ideas studied in lessons connect to real places and real stories.



Year 8 students visited Bin Jelmoood House, where they explored the history of slavery and human exploitation in the region. The museum visit helped students develop a deeper understanding of the slave trade in Qatar and the wider Gulf, while also encouraging thoughtful reflection on themes of freedom, human rights and the importance of remembering difficult parts of history. The experience provided valuable context for their classroom studies and allowed students to engage with powerful historical evidence and narratives.



HUMANITIES OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM

Year 10 and Year 11 students carried out their IGCSE Geography fieldwork along the coast, investigating coastal processes as well as aspects of urban planning and development in Qatar. Students collected data, observed how the coastline is shaped and managed, and considered how urban growth affects the surrounding environment. The fieldwork gave students the opportunity to apply the enquiry skills they have been developing in class while strengthening their understanding of how geography is used to study and manage real environments.



HUMANITIES WEEK

Humanities Week was a fantastic celebration of learning across Environmental Management, Geography, History, History of Qatar and Psychology, bringing these subjects to life across the school. The week began with students exploring powerful ideas about slavery, freedom and human rights in Qatar, encouraging thoughtful discussion about the past and its impact on the present. Students also took part in a School Recycling Audit and Action Station, where they investigated how our school manages waste and thought carefully about how small changes can make a real difference to the environment. The activities quickly showed students that the humanities are not only about learning facts but about understanding the world and thinking about how it can be improved.

The middle of the week provided a powerful moment of historical reflection for senior students through a special screening examining the Nuremberg Trials. Students explored how the world responded to the crimes of the Nazis after the Second World War and discussed the challenge of holding war criminals accountable. The session encouraged thoughtful discussion about justice, responsibility and the importance of international law. Many students were struck by how the decisions made after the war still shape the way international justice operates today.

The week finished with a celebration of culture and creativity inspired by Qatar's heritage. Students enjoyed a pearl jewellery making activity where they designed their own necklaces and bracelets while learning about the country's historic pearling industry. The activity was both creative and educational, helping students appreciate an important part of Qatar's history in a fun and memorable way. Humanities Week was a brilliant reminder that these subjects help students explore the past, understand the present and connect learning to the real world.

Throughout the week, students enthusiastically participated in Kahoot science challenges, testing their knowledge in a fun and competitive way. Break times also became hubs of excitement as students gathered around to attempt the Break Time Physics Challenges, applying problem-solving skills to practical puzzles and demonstrations. Another popular highlight was Magic Chemistry, where students observed fascinating chemical reactions that demonstrated the surprising and exciting side of science.

Our Year 7 students took part in a thrilling forensic investigation activity. Working as young detectives, students analysed clues and evidence to solve the case. With the help of investigative teams from 7GG, 7BR and 7GB, the mystery was successfully solved and the culprit – Ms. Faye – was “caught” through careful scientific reasoning and teamwork.

Our Year 9 students participated in a school-wide science scavenger hunt, racing around the campus solving clues related to scientific concepts, famous discoveries, and laboratory equipment.

Tutor groups across the school also joined in the celebrations by taking part in a “Guess the Scientist” challenge, identifying prominent scientists from clues and images. In addition, to mark the International Day of Education, students delivered outstanding presentations on the biographies of influential scientists, showcasing their research, communication skills, and appreciation for the people who have shaped scientific progress.

During the week, many students also competed in the internal rounds of the NIA Barwa Dr. Jabr Research Competition, presenting impressive research ideas and scientific investigations.

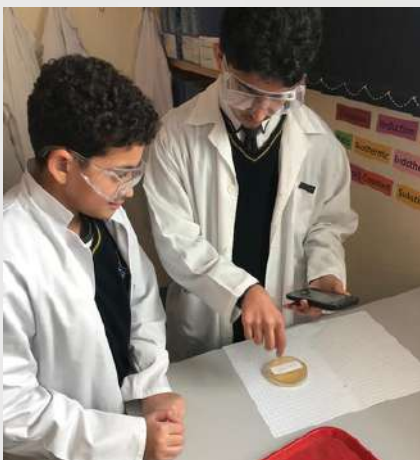
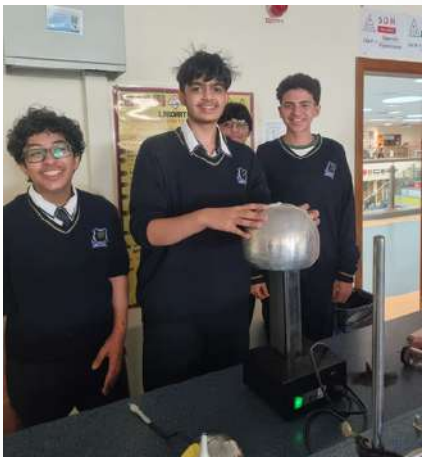
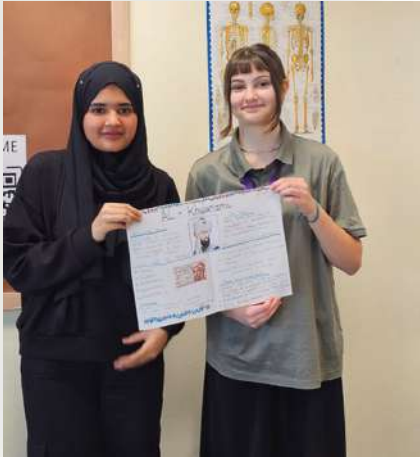

DR. JABR'S COMPETITION

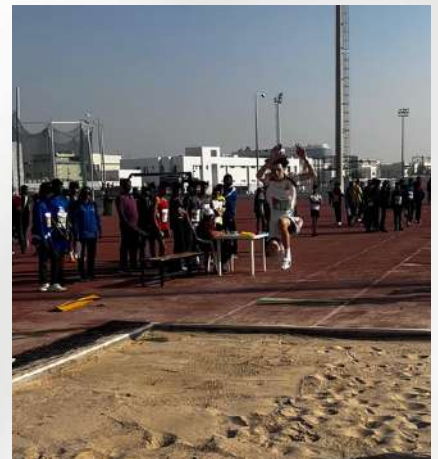
ATHLETICS QSOP – BOYS

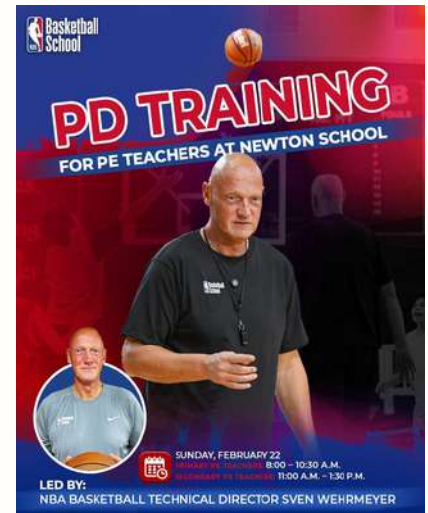
BASKETBALL PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PE NEWTON TEACHERS

Experiences like this go far beyond sport. They provide inspiration, build confidence, and allow our students to see elite-level events from a unique perspective.



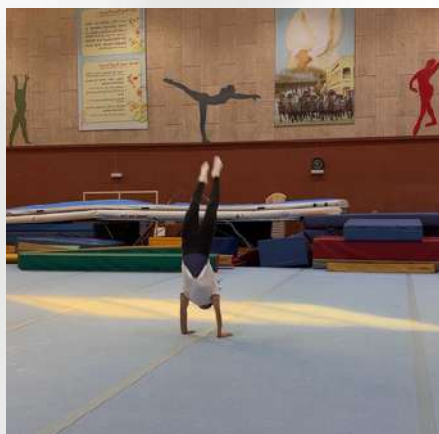

Our students successfully completed their Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Adventurous Journey in Zekreet, as part of the Bronze level of the Award Programme. The journey took place in the unique landscape of Zekreet, providing the ideal environment for students to navigate, camp, and complete their planned route. They demonstrated outstanding commitment throughout the expedition, engaging fully in all aspects of the journey – from route planning and map reading to cooking, camp setup, and environmental awareness.

The team — **Adam Qassim (Year 10), Anas Timeridjine, Ashish Dhakal, Omer Abdalla (Year 12)**, and **Mohammad Ayman (Year 10)** — demonstrated exceptional teamwork, creativity, and technical skill.

Students also performed strongly in several **mathematics competitions**. 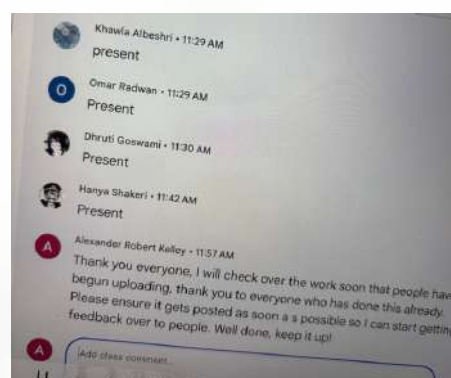
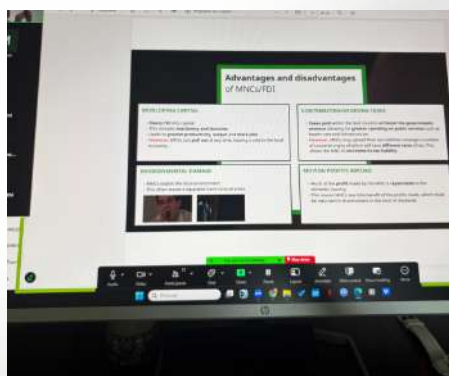
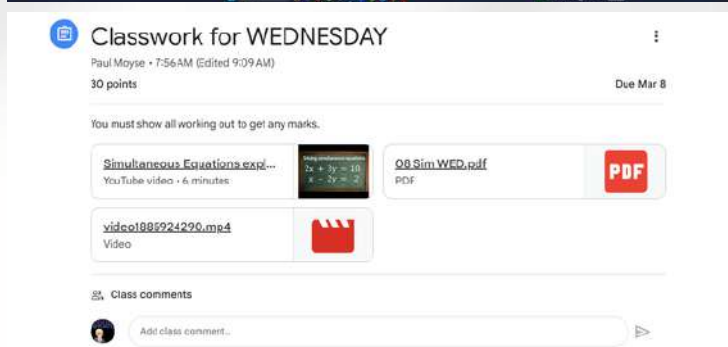
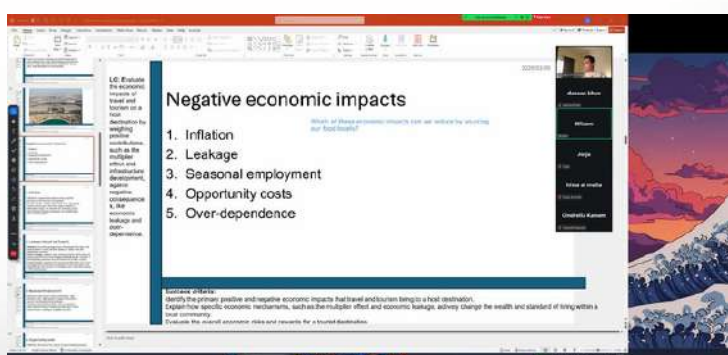
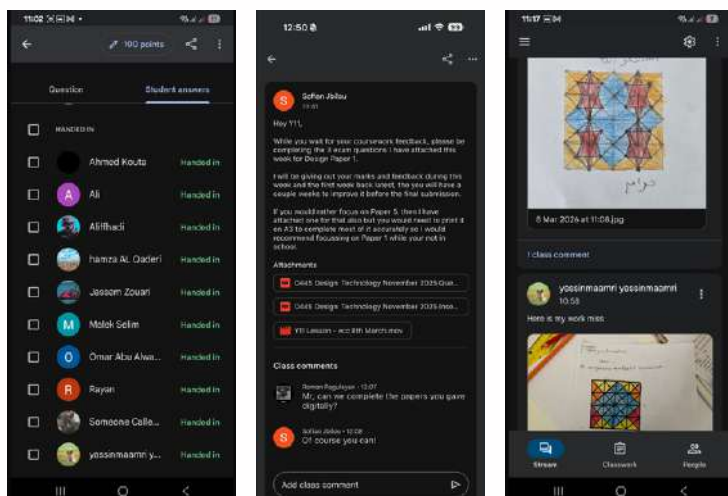
OMAN TRIP

Although prizes were awarded, every single participant should feel proud. Each act brought something special to the stage, and the standard of performances was exceptionally high.

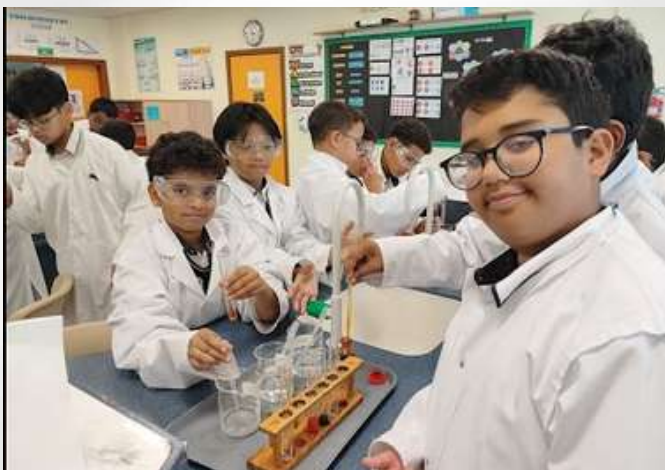
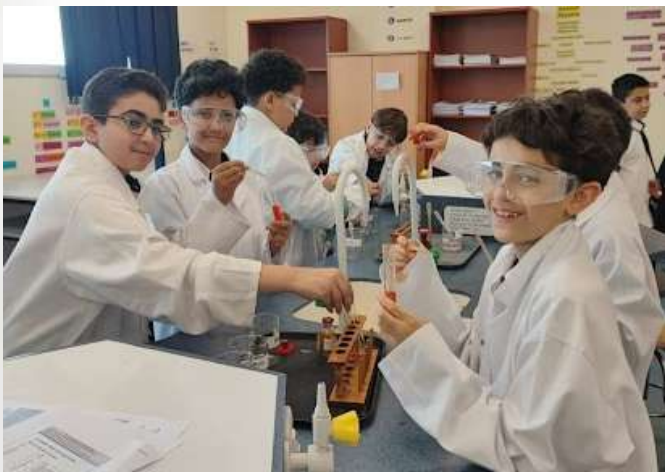
