A Word from the Head of Secondary

nother successful start to the new academic year! NIA Secondary staff and students continue to reach for the sky and consistently achieve excellence due to their hard work and dedication. This newsletter illustrates the level of our expertise as well as a deep care for our students. We never hesitate to go the extra mile for every student at NIA and daily support and holistically develop them. I am very proud to share with our community how special NIA Secondary really is. This can be, however also seen daily on our official school Instagram page: nia_barwa_city, which I hope you all are following.

Yet again, our summer iGCSE and AS and A level results were strong. Well done to our iGCSE and AS/A levels top achievers and a huge thank you to all teachers supporting them!!! In 2023, despite the stricter grade boundaries, 76% of our students achieved A*-C /9-4 in at least 5 iGCSE subjects. 75% of all iGCS grades were C/4 and above, 32% of all iGCSE grades at NIA were A/7 and above and our Year 11 students achieved in total 101 A* and 146 As! Congratulations to Rahma Eissa who achieved 11 A* in her iGCSE exams! Top achievers in Year 11: Abdul Bari, Marwa Zaidi, Nour Hazem and Tasmeen Abubaker - 10 Bs and above.

In AS, 80% of our students passed successfully at least 2 AS exams, 51% of all AS grades were C and above and our Year 12 students achieved in total 83 As (top grades in AS). Congratulations to Shaikha Al Emadi, Khaled Adel, Hamza Shahzad, Mohammed Mudathir, Muhammad Dani, Alhoura Ahen, Aisha Nisar and Priscila Agbozo, and who achieved 4 As!








EDIBURG
