Term 2 has been a short yet exceptionally intense and rewarding chapter in our academic year. We are incredibly proud to announce that NIA has received the Well-being Award for Students (WAS)—a reflection of the unwavering commitment and hard work from both staff and students. In EAL this term, the children have been exploring fascinating facts in a non-fiction book, as well as sharing a funny tale with friends. Reading has helped spark imagination and build their confidence. Our classroom is buzzing with eager readers, discovering new worlds and expanding their knowledge.





The Nessy Intervention Programme is designed to improve reading and spelling skills.

Through engaging, interactive activities, it focuses on phonemic awareness, decoding, and spelling patterns, helping students build confidence and fluency at their own pace.

In writing, we used the Widgit platform to provide visual support by pairing pictures with each word in the model text. This helped ensure that children fully understood the text, expanded their vocabulary, and engaged in role-playing. We then incorporated scaffolding and various strategies to further support them in independently writing their own text.








In Primary PE lessons this last term KS1 focused on improving their swimming skills. In KS2 the pupils learnt skills, rules and tactics of Football and Volleyball.










Year 4: In Year 4, children have been learning numbers up to 31, the days of the week, months of the year, and how to write and say the date in French.



Year 3 has dived into the fascinating world of Networks! They've explored how devices connect and communicate, unlocking the secrets behind the internet!


Meanwhile, our Year 4 students have become budding web designers! They've learned how websites are created using HTML and explored the magic behind the internet!



Our Amazing Afterschool Clubs!


















Accreditations & Awards
