They kicked off the term by taking part in Anti-Bullying Week, where they focused on kindness, inclusion, and standing up against bullying. They also embraced the love of
























SPORTINGEVENTS














P4C

In Upper KS2, Year 5 have learned about the types of computer networks and its vital role in every Local Area Networks. Through engaging hands-on activities and lively discussions in the Lab, they have explored how these networks function and connect us to the digital world. Various LAN topologies have also been explored, igniting a passion for technology.

In Programming, our learners have also cross-linked Maths by exploring Geometry through LOGO, a text-based coding language. Additionally, learners have also acquired knowledge about the evolution of Artificial Intelligence, gaining insight to the brilliant minds behind this technology. Students have reflected on how AI is transforming the way we live and work these days. Our Year 6 digital learners have been getting their tech on by combining technology with conceptual learning. This has helped them develop their digital literacy skills as they have explored Artificial Intelligence features of Bixby, Chat GPT, Alexa, and Siri. The Cloud Computing Model types and structures were most learned through SmartArt Diagrams representation.

They've also delved deep into learning how to read, code, and decode the Qatar Identification Cards for both locals and residents. They have also gained an understanding of how Internet Service Providers (ISPs) play such an important role in the ICT field, as well as how ISO (International Service Organization) is governing codes for each country, ensuring smooth communication worldwide

As we're in the spiral National Curriculum, The KS2 kids have been revised on how to safeguard themselves Online. Wrapping it all up, It's been a wild ride through the world of Information and Communications Technology for these kids


ATTENDANCE GEMS










Our Amazing Afterschool Clubs!
