to finish!










EYFS ECAS






We also celebrated Humanities Week, with a special focus on old-fashioned transport.

We went for a walk around Barwa City where we discussed settlements, area classifications and different features of our community.










NIA has invested in our AESN department by incorporating an AI-powered academic programme through Century. Pupils complete a diagnostic assessment, after which the AI generates individualised learning pathways tailored to each child's specific needs.

These pathways include personalised PowerPoints, videos, lessons, and targeted questions designed to address gaps in learning. This approach has taken differentiation and personalisation to the next level, allowing us to target every learner's unique needs with precision.



















Year 3 and Year 4 also took part in swimming lessons, working on water confidence, stroke technique, and overall swimming ability.

Year 4 have continued to build their French skills with confidence and creativity.




Year 6 have shown great maturity and independence in their French learning this year.
















P4C






