- To encourage respect amongst the staff and students.
- Students should wear their school uniform as a representation of their school pride

## **Uniform Policy**

Students should be dressed in full uniform each day. Students may come to school in their PE kit on PE days. Uniforms are available to purchase at NIS Lagoon. A detailed outline of the required uniform is found on the next page and in the student planner. It is an expectation that both parents and students adhere strictly to the required dress code and ensure that students are neatly and appropriately presented at all times. ## School Uniform Procedures 2025-26

Before the school year

- The Principal will send uniform pictures and reminders to parents.
- Uniform shop hours shared with parents.

Start of the school year

- The Head Teacher and Class Teachers give reminders about uniform.
  - Team Leaders discuss uniform at assemblies.
- Class Teachers send home timetable with reminder of PE days.
- Class Teachers send home uniform pictures via Class Dojo.

### Weekly Reminders

- Class Teachers recognise and praise pupils in the correct uniform.
  - Class Teachers remind relevant parents about uniform requirements and uniform shop opening hours.



## **Deepening Thinking**



 In P4C sessions, discuss ideas such as fairness, identity and belonging.

### Role Model

- Show pupils how presentation can reflect respect and responsibility by wearing your teacher 'uniform'.
- Speak positively about school uniform and praise pupils wearing it.

## **Impact**

- Reinforce how uniform contributes to our school identity and community.
- Help pupils understand that uniform creates unity and reduces distractions.

## Challenge



- Address misconceptions or resistance with empathy while reinforcing expectations.
- Support pupils who struggle with uniform by understanding individual circumstances.

## **Engagement**



 Praise students and thank parents when the correct uniform is worn consistently.

<ul> <li>o McKenzie tartan straight cut skirt, calf to ankle length or loose fitting navy blue trousers.</li> <li>o White linen shirt with school logo on left side.</li> <li>o Optional white t-shirt (can be long sleeved) may be worn underneath.</li> <li>o School tartan scarf (to be tied properly and worn up to neck)</li> <li>o Plain colour coat, no large logos.</li> <li>o Plain black or navy headwear (optional)</li> <li>o White ankle socks</li> <li>o Plain, flat black leather shoes with no motif or white heel. No trainer styles</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>o Navy blue trousers.</li> <li>o White linen shirt with school logo on left side.</li> <li>o Shirt must be tucked in at all times</li> <li>o Plain, flat black leather shoes with no motif.</li> <li>Should be business not trainer style</li> <li>o School jumper with logo</li> </ul>
	o Plain white T shirt or vest to be worn under shirt (optional). o School tartan tie (to be tied properly and worn up to the neck) o School sweatshirt/fleece jacket (available term 2) – NO HOODS o Plain colour coat, no large logos, School cap only may be worn at break times only.

 No black trousers and jumpers are allowed.

o Abaya – Abaya must be plain black with no patterns. It must be fastened up with the school uniform worn underneath. Key Stage 4 students and 5 only.





## **Physical Education**

- o Plain navy shorts/ trousers
- o School polo shirt, a plain white vest may be worn under shirt (optional)
- o Trainers

#### **Jewellery**

Girls	Boys
<ul> <li>o One pair of small stud or sleeper earrings</li> <li>o Watch o Necklaces, rings, pendants,</li> <li>bracelets or any other type of jewellery is</li> <li>not allowed.</li> <li>o No make-up or nail varnish is to be worn.</li> </ul>	o Watch o No earrings, necklaces or jewellery.

#### **Hair styles**

- o Hair for both girls and boys should be conventional in style. Hair dye is not permitted.
- o Hair accessories for girls should be in the school colours.
- o Hijab/scarves should be navy or black

Failure to adhere to the Uniform Policy will result in the following consequences Each stage parents will be contacted to inform them of the issue:

Primary - see 'Uniform Policy Procedures' flowchart above

#### Secondary

1st time - warning and contact home 2nd time - a 15-minute detention and contact home 3rd time - a 45-minute detention and contact home 4th time - Internal isolation and contact home

Pupils not dressed in their correct uniform will not be allowed to participate on school outings/trips.
