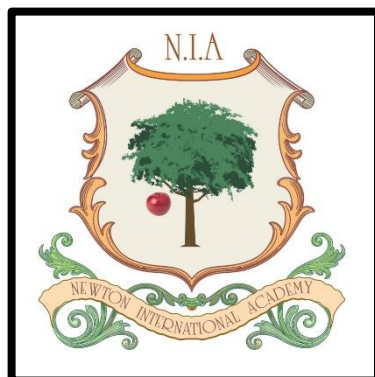

MISSION

We aim to provide the highest quality of education possible for students of all abilities. In doing so, we aim to positively encourage each student to achieve academic excellence, enjoy creative diversity, develop critical thinking skills, and become lifelong learners and responsible citizens. To achieve this, we will provide a diverse education in a safe, supportive environment that promotes self-discipline and motivation. We will work in partnership with our staff, students, parents, and the wider community to achieve our vision.

AIM

The aim of this policy is to outline the curriculum framework at NIA Lusail, ensuring it is inclusive, forward-thinking, and responsive to the needs of a diverse student body. The curriculum is designed to support holistic development by fostering academic curiosity, creative expression, personal growth, and global awareness. At NIA Lusail, we seek to equip students with the knowledge, values, and transferable skills they need to succeed academically and thrive in life beyond school. The curriculum fosters independent learning, collaboration, and reflective practice, laying the foundation for lifelong learning and responsible global citizenship.

RATIONALE

At NIA Lusail, we believe that education should take place in a safe, nurturing, and intellectually stimulating environment that allows students to grow in confidence, competence, and character. Our curriculum is rooted in the principles of inclusivity, academic ambition, and student empowerment.

We encourage students to explore ideas, ask meaningful questions, take academic risks, and learn from their mistakes. Lessons are designed to be relevant, challenging, and engaging, promoting deep understanding, critical thinking, and creative problem-solving. Our goal is to ensure that all students, regardless of background or ability, are given the opportunity to achieve success and feel valued as members of the school community.

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CURRICULUM DELIVERY

The curriculum at NIA Lusail represents the full breadth of the learning experience, encompassing formal instruction, enrichment activities, school routines, and personal development opportunities. Curriculum delivery is student-centred, and teachers are encouraged to integrate technology, collaborative strategies, and cross-curricular connections to enhance engagement. Where appropriate, the use of digital resources is embedded to support personalised learning and promote 21st-century skills.

LITERACY ACROSS THE CURRICULUM

We aim to ensure all students at NIA Lusail become effective communicators who are confident in expressing their ideas across subjects. Literacy is a shared responsibility across the curriculum and supports academic achievement and personal growth.

Students are taught to:

- Express themselves clearly and appropriately in both speech and writing.
- Apply correct spelling, grammar, and punctuation consistently.
- Structure their writing logically and coherently.
- Listen actively and engage in respectful discussion.
- Read with understanding and synthesise information from multiple sources.
- Communicate confidently with a variety of audiences.

13. HEALTH AND SAFETY

At NIA Lusail, the wellbeing and safety of our students are paramount. All subjects are delivered in alignment with established Health and Safety guidelines. Particular emphasis is placed on high-risk areas such as Science, Design and Technology, ICT, Art and Design, and Physical Education. Within these subjects, students are explicitly taught to:

- Recognise hazards, assess risks, and implement appropriate control measures.
- Take responsibility for managing their environment to ensure their own safety and that of others.

Teachers ensure that learning spaces are safe, organised, and conducive to both academic success and personal wellbeing.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

We are committed to ensuring that every student at NIA Lusail reaches their personal academic potential. To achieve this, we provide targeted academic support tailored to individual needs through a range of strategies. In Secondary, students who require additional help can access academic support through structured Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs) or by receiving small-group or one-on-one intervention.

Support is also embedded within the classroom through differentiated instruction and adaptive teaching. These approaches ensure that all students, regardless of background or ability, receive the guidance and challenge they need to succeed.



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ADAPTIVE TEACHING

Adaptive teaching lies at the core of NIA Lusail's commitment to inclusive and responsive education. It ensures that all students are engaged, supported, and appropriately challenged.

This approach includes:

- Understanding and planning for the diverse needs of students, including their prior knowledge, learning profiles, and potential barriers.
- Delivering targeted support to learners who require additional help, while maintaining high expectations for all students.
- Using flexible grouping strategies to provide tailored learning experiences and to monitor student progress, motivation, and engagement.
- Incorporating educational technologies and software to support all learners, including those with special educational needs and disabilities.

Adaptive teaching empowers students by providing equitable access to learning while promoting independence and academic growth.

SAFEGUARDING

NIA Lusail is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare and safety of all students. We ensure that:

- All staff are trained in safeguarding procedures and clearly understand their responsibilities.
- A Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) is appointed to oversee all safeguarding practices.
- Staff receive regular training and updates to maintain compliance with all safeguarding policies and procedures.

Safeguarding is a whole-school priority and underpins our duty of care to every child.

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

Responsibility for implementing this curriculum policy rests with the Principal, who works collaboratively with the Senior Leadership Team, Heads of Department, and classroom teachers. The curriculum is reviewed annually through structured SMT meetings and departmental reviews to ensure it remains effective, inclusive, and aligned with both school priorities and Ministry of Education expectations.

THE SECONDARY CURRICULUM

At NIA Lusail, the curriculum is designed to provide a broad and balanced learning experience, grounded in the National Curriculum of England and Wales and adapted to meet the needs of students in Qatar.

- Key Stage 3: Years 7, 8, and 9 – All subjects are compulsory, ensuring students receive a well-rounded foundation across disciplines.
- Key Stage 4: Year 10 – English, Mathematics, Physical Education (PE), and either Islamic Studies or Citizenship are compulsory. Students also begin selecting optional IGCSE subjects tailored to their interests and future goals.

The Key Stage 4 curriculum is informed by UK-based standards, with examinations set by Edexcel and Cambridge (CIE) to ensure academic rigour and international recognition. Our curriculum model is also reviewed for



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appropriateness and compliance with the expectations of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MOEHE).
