

EYFS HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Health and Safety of all children in the EYFS department at Newton International Academy is our utmost concern. We take great pride in the children's overall health and safety.

At Newton International Academy we are committed to establish a learning environment that promotes good healthy choices and good health.

It is important that all staff follow the policy to ensure that it is consistent and used effectively, this allows best practice to take place.

Risk assessment

Risk assessments of the school are carried out on a weekly basis to ensure the safety of all children. These risk assessments are recorded in the schools' one drive. Class teachers are responsible for the daily risk assessment of their own classroom. Safety checks are carried out by EYFS coordinator at the beginning and end of the day to check for any issues.

Outside area

Risk assessments of the outside area are carried out on a weekly basis. Safety checks are carried out by EYFS coordinator at the beginning and end of the day to check for any issues. The children are advised to wear a hat and glasses whilst playing outside.

Sun Safety

All areas of the outdoor area are shaded from the sun. However, all parents are asked to apply sun cream at home on their children. All children are advised to wear a hat and glasses whilst playing outside in the sun.

Water activities

All water activities are supervised by a staff member to ensure safety.

Hygiene

The classrooms are cleaned twice daily, a checklist of the last cleaning time can be found in each EYFS classroom. Tables are cleaned before and after snack time. Children are encouraged to wash their hands before snack times. All toys are cleaned at the end of each term by individual class teachers/TA. Hand sanitizer, wipes, gloves and aprons can be found in each classroom.
