

Primary Curriculum

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 (Years 1 to 6)

At Newton International Academy Barwa, our primary curriculum is based on the National Curriculum for England (2014), carefully adapted to suit our international context and diverse student body. We are committed to providing a **broad, balanced, and inclusive education** that nurtures each child's academic, social, emotional, and moral development.

Our curriculum ensures students develop key foundational skills while building a lifelong love of learning. It is designed to prepare children for the next phase of their education as confident, reflective, and responsible global citizens.

Curriculum Aims

- Promote high academic standards for all learners.
- Foster curiosity, creativity, and independent thinking.
- Ensure mastery of key knowledge and skills across all subjects.
- Promote social, moral, spiritual, and cultural awareness.
- Support emotional well-being, physical health, and resilience.
- Encourage active citizenship and environmental responsibility.
- Enrich learning through wider experiences beyond the classroom.
- Develop lifelong learners prepared for future success.

Curriculum Structure

Our Primary phase is organised into:

- **Key Stage 1:** Years 1–2
- **Key Stage 2:** Years 3–6

Each key stage offers a carefully planned curriculum with a balance of **core subjects** and **foundation subjects**, delivered through evidence-informed teaching strategies.

Core Teaching Approaches

- **English:** We follow the *Talk for Writing* approach to develop language, reading, and writing skills through oral rehearsal, innovation, and independent application. Reading is supported by Oxford Reading Tree and guided reading aligned to National Curriculum content domains.
- **Mathematics:** Our Maths curriculum is delivered using *White Rose Maths* with the CPA (Concrete–Pictorial–Abstract) model to strengthen conceptual understanding and problem-solving skills.
- **Science:** Children engage in hands-on scientific enquiry through investigation, experimentation, and analysis.

Specialist Support

- Phonics is taught daily in KS1.
- Reading is taught once weekly in Y1 and three times weekly in Y2–Y6.
- Arabic and Islamic Studies are delivered at differentiated fluency levels.
- French is taught from Year 3 onwards by a specialist teacher.
- PE, Art, ICT, and Music are delivered through dedicated subject specialists.

Timetabling

Each year group receives 35 lessons per week, with all subjects allocated specific instructional time. Cross-curricular links and integrated teaching approaches enrich the learning experience.

Assessment and Target Setting

- Targets in Maths and Writing are set twice per year.
- Formative and summative assessments guide teaching.
- Marking, feedback, and classroom observation inform progress tracking.
- Progress is reported to students and parents regularly.

Inclusion and Support

At Newton International Academy Barwa, we are committed to providing an inclusive learning environment that recognises and supports the diverse needs of all learners.

AESN (Additional Educational Support Needs)

Students receive support through a **graduated approach**:

- **Wave 1:** High-quality, inclusive classroom teaching that includes universal strategies such as scaffolding, differentiation, and visual supports.
- **Wave 2:** Targeted small-group interventions tailored to specific areas of need (e.g., phonics, reading comprehension, social skills).
- **Wave 3:** Personalised and specialist provision for students with more complex needs. This may include Individual Education Plans (IEPs), behaviour support plans, and input from specialists.

Provision is reviewed regularly in collaboration with parents, class teachers, and the AESN team to ensure students are making progress towards their individual targets.

EAL (English as an Additional Language)

Our EAL students are supported through a combination of in-class strategies and withdrawal sessions as needed. We focus on supporting language acquisition while ensuring students are able to access the full curriculum. EAL provision is adapted to different levels of English fluency and may include visual aids, pre-teaching of vocabulary, and structured speaking and listening activities.

Parental Engagement

- Termly curriculum letters and weekly Dojo updates.
- Parent workshops and information sessions.
- Home learning booklets and digital access to resources.
- Annual sharing of LTPs and assessment updates.

Extra-Curricular Activities

- We offer a wide range of ECAs that enhance academic, creative, and physical development, helping students grow into confident and well-rounded individuals.
