The PTA has had a full and busy term. This year for the first time since the start of the Covid Pandemic, we had a school fair. What a lovely day it was. There were a number of external stalls as well as our normal teacher stalls. This year the PTA Committee ran the Tea Garden and spent the afternoon pouring cups of tea and coffee for parents and guests. This term we had our QNSA accreditation inspection for 5 days in January. It went well and we hope to receive a good result from the MOE — Insha'Allah. The inspectors left us with very many good points that they had observed and one of them asked the process to get their child into the school. We expect to receive notification of the outcome of this inspection in the next week or two.


