Term 1

This Term's News

This Term, the children have been busy settling into their new school. They have done exceptionally well, and you, their parents, should be proud of their achievements so far.

In Phonics, we focused on recognising different sounds in the environment. We explored sounds made by our bodies and musical instruments to understand how sounds can differ. We began learning the letters sounds s, a, and t.

In Talk for Writing, we explored the story 'Owl Babies'. We introduced the story to the children by building their excitement with a 'hook'. The children practised retelling the story using actions and a story map. The children were inspired by our trip to the aquarium to innovate the story, and we changed it to 'Aquarium Animals'. The children came up with new actions that helped them retell their innovated story.

In Maths, we have been singing number rhymes and beginning to use mathematical language such as 'more', 'less', 'full' and 'empty'.



The children went on their first trip to the aquarium. They went to the 4D cinema to learn all about Hamad Port and how it was built. They then explored the aquarium, where they saw lots of different sea animals. They saw jellyfish, starfish, sea snakes, a baby shark and lots of different kinds of fish. The children loved their first trip of the year.

The children began their first Talk for Writing, 'Owl Babies'. Before we began the story, the children found an owl's nest in the school. It had 3 eggs inside and the children could see the owl's shadow on the roof. Each day, we went back to see if the eggs had cracked. The children's language and imagination skills were fantastic as they came up with many different ideas on why there was a nest and where the owls went when the eggs cracked. This sparked the children's enthusiasm for our story.


Next term, Foundation 1 classes will go on a school trip to Baladna Farm. We will also be visited by the Build a Bear company.

The children will take part in Science Week and Sports Week.

The school will host our annual School Fair Day, where you can participate in many different games and activities with your family.

In Term 2, the Foundation 1 teachers will organise a parent's workshop focused on phonics. We will give you an overview of the phonics programme we use, how we implement it in our classrooms, how you can support this learning at home, and the importance of phonics to your child's learning.

Parent-teacher meetings will be held on the 14th and 15th of January.









Foundation 2

Term 1 This Term's News



In Term 1, F2 have worked so hard within their Phonics. The children have been learning to recognise, read and write letter sounds. They have made v..v..volcanoes and j..j..jam sandwiches. The children are now starting to read and write words through a variety of hands-on activities, such as printing letter sounds into playdough to build a word.

In Maths, the children have focused on recognising, representing and comparing numbers to 5. They have also been learning about 2D shapes and patterns. The children have gone on shape hunts around the school.

In Literacy, the children have been learning to retell the story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. Their learning began when they found a letter in their classroom and some clues the bears had left! Inspired by the story, the children created artwork and story maps and labelled their drawings of bears. Each F2 class have also innovated the story using their own amazing ideas.

F2 has had such an exciting first term in school. The children had lots of fun on their trip with the Doha Bus Tour, where they travelled around Doha to visit MIA Park and Souq Waqif. The children were so surprised to find the three bears hiding around Doha waiting for them. The children all behaved excellently, and their teachers were so proud of them.

We have also celebrated Book Week, where F2 were thinking all about the story 'Giraffes Can't Dance'. The children enjoyed making giraffe cookies to eat whilst listening to a story. They also had lots of fun coming into school in their cosy pyjamas and dressing up as their favourite story costume.

The children also enjoyed participating in our House Day games and races, where all the F2 classes competed against each other to earn points. It was a super day which promoted teamwork across the year group!











In Term 2, we are so excited to be taking F2 on a trip to Heenat Salma Farm, where the children can participate in lots of hands-on experiences and learn about a working farm. The date of the trip will be confirmed in Term 2.

As a whole school, we will also celebrate Science Week and Sports Week in Term 2.

The F2 teachers will hold a parent workshop based on Maths learning in F2. This will be an excellent opportunity to understand how the children in F2 learn the different mathematical concepts and support parents with how to help their children at home.

Year 1 Term 1 This Term's News



Term 1 has been a great success for Year 1, and we are very proud of everything they have accomplished! The children have enjoyed learning about 'The Little Red Hen' in English this term. We learnt the text and created actions and the children then used their imagination to invent their own story where they changed the characters and setting. They have worked especially hard during Phonics lessons, where they have been blending and segmenting words.

In Maths, we have been learning addition and subtraction to 10. We have enjoyed creating number sentences up to 10. Year 1 has shown great independence and fantastic behaviour when moving around the school!

In Science this term, the children enjoyed learning about animal groups. They especially enjoyed learning what animals eat and their titles: carnivore, herbivore and omnivore.











We went on a school trip to the Oli Oli Children's Museum this term. The children had the best day and enjoyed exploring water and air. They most enjoyed creating their own pictures and then having them reflected onto the wall where they had to find their own work.

We also celebrated Book Week, where the children enjoyed reading Julia Donaldson's books. Our favourite book was 'The Gruffalo'; the children have enjoyed reading it repeatedly. They also dressed up as their favourite book character and enjoyed the Parade around school.

This term was busy with many fun days, and we ended it with House Day. The children were excited to be dressed in their house colours. They enjoyed all their games and focused on team building to work with their housemates.

We are looking forward to more special days in Term 2!

We are planning another trip for next term, which will be educational and fun and allow the children to learn outside the classroom. We will give you more details about the class trip nearer the time.

In Mathematics, we will be adding and subtracting numbers to 20. We have worked very hard on addition and subtraction this term, so we are excited to work with bigger numbers next term!

In English, we will begin looking at instruction writing and why we use instructions. We will have a fun topic around this, which we are excited to share with the children.

In Topic we are looking forward to learning all about 'Changes in living memory' by comparing toys from the past in our History lessons. We will be looking at what toys looked like and what materials they were made from. Many new lessons and exciting learning will take place in Term 2!


















Year 6 students learnt about sports and expressed their opinions about different activities. They also learnt about clothes and their colours. They can count to 80 and say how much various items cost.




Special Events




