Philosophy for Children – P4C

In Term 2 we worked on improving our talking and listening skills by discussing questions. Every week we practiced sitting in a circle and answering a question which can have more than one answer. We gave our opinion by explaining why we chose the answer. For example, in week 7 we had the following question: "Would you rather be a doctor or a Nurse?" Each of us chose what we would rather be and explained why. During P4C lessons, we also play loads of fun games to help us build the confidence we need to answer questions.





<u> Topic – People Who Help Us</u>



This Term we enjoyed learning about People Who Help Us. We explored many different occupations including firefighters, police officers, doctors and nurses, vets and teachers. We learned what their job is and how they help us for example, doctors can help us feel better when we are sick by giving us medicine. During this topic, we did many arts and crafts activities to help us with our understanding and we even made our school nurse a Thank You card! This topic helped us understand different roles in society and how we can appreciate the people who help us.

<u>Phonics</u> and Talk for Writing

This term in phonics we have begun to learn some initial sounds, such as, 's' 'a' 't' 'p' 'i' 'n'. We have explored what words begin with these sounds and how to identify and write these letters. For each sound we also completed a craft activity for example, we made parrots for the sound 'p' which was so much fun!

In Talk for Writing, we read the story "My way home". For this, we drew our own story map and created actions to help us retell the story from beginning to end. This story also helped us recongise different countries' flags and food from around the world. Talk for Writing lessons have been very enjoyable this Term and have helped all children develop their literacy skills.

Foundation 2

Maths


In Mathematics this term, we have learnt about numbers 1-10 in detail. We have looked at different ways to make numbers 1-10 by using the part whole model to break down the numbers. We have introduced addition and the children are starting to write their own number sentences. The children enjoyed learning about capacity and weight and finding out which container holds more. The children have continued to learn patterns and are able to make their own patterns.





Talk for Writing





In Talk For Writing lessons this term, the children have been retelling stories we have learned. The first story was 'Whatever Next'. The second story was 'Pete the cat and his four groovy buttons'. The children learned actions for both stories and then went on to change some characters in the story to help them make up their own. They have really enjoyed completing art activities based around these stories.

Foundation 2

Phonics

We have been learning many new sounds and tricky words in our Phonics lessons this term. We have started with our Streamed Phonics lessons across all F2 classes, to support all children with reading and writing sounds according to their ability. The children have enjoyed going to different classes and teachers for their phonics lessons, also making new friends. The children have been doing wonderful writing, some children are even starting to read and write sentences on their own! Super work, everyone!

Topics



This Term we had the chance to learn about 2 different topics. The first one explored was 'Space' and what can be found up there. We learned about our 8 planets and are able to identify the one we live on. We learned about what aliens might look like, do and eat. We learned about astronauts, what they wear and do up in space. And we learned about rockets/ space ships and the purpose of a rocket. We really loved this topic!

Our final topic was Scientists and Inventors. We learned about Isaac Newton and his discovery of gravity. We learned about Marie Curie and her help in developing the x-ray machine. We learned about Thomas Edison and his invention of the electric lightbulb. And we learned about the Wright Brothers who invented the very first airplane!

Foundation 2

This term in P4C we explored what it meant to be responsible for our belongings and our actions. In our P4C lessons we talked about identify such as what makes us who we are and how we are different from our friends. Years 1 and 2

IC⁻

Throughout term 2 in Year 1 and 2 we have learned how to use the computer keyboard and Microsoft Word. In year 1 we started by looking at how to type the alphabet. This helped the children find where all the letters are on the keyboard. We then progressed to writing sentences in year 1 and learned how to use the space bar for "finger spaces". Year 1 also learned how to use the enter and delete keys properly. Both years 1 and 2 also learned how to underline words. In year 2 we developed our Microsoft Word skills by writing more advanced sentences. In year 2 we also learned how to use bold and italic. Finally, in year 2 we learned how to change the style of the font.



Year 3

Term 2's focus for Year 3 in ICT has been learning how to use Microsoft Publisher, Microsoft Publisher is an application that helps children learn how to create publications such as birthday cards, posters and leaflets. We learned how to insert and format shapes. Year 3 learned how to change the fill and outline of a shape as well as rotating and changing the size. We also learned how to add boarders and images to our publications, including inserting an image into a shape. Children in year 3 created some posters on computer hardware which they now have a good understanding of. We also looked at how to change the brightness of an image so that it is appropriate to use as a background.

ICT-SZO

Year 4

In year 4 this term we have been learning how to program using Scratch. Scratch is a visual programming language which is an excellent introduction to computer coding. We learned a variety of programming skills such as how to start a program, use conditions ('IF' functions) and loops. With all of the skills that we gained in year 4 we created an advanced game where a character could drive around a racing track and "crash" if it came off the track. Some children in year 4 even made a two player game!



Years 5 and 6

In years 5 and 6 we have been learning how to use Microsoft Word and Excel. We started the term by learning some of the areas of Microsoft Word that the pupils were not so familiar with. This included skills such as separating text into columns, creating our own bullet points and changing the style of our documents. In both years 5 and 6 we then progressed onto Microsoft Excel (with year 6 using some of the more advanced features). We learned that Microsoft Excel is a spreadsheet and how it can be used to help us. We used a range of formulas and functions in Excel and discovered the difference between the three main cursers in the program.

French ★★★★ Term 2:French Newsletter

Year 3

In year 3 we are the stars

We have been learning how to count from 1 to 20 by memory, to name various geometric shapes, to identify the names of different domestic and wild animals ,to say some new vocabulary about the fruits referring to the pictures. This gave the children a better understanding .We also learned how to spell and divide the names into syllables. We can say singular and plural pronouns .We have also been singing songs to help us remember what we have learned. It was a fantastic term!

Year 4 Yes, we speak French

In year 4 we are the stars

In French, this Term we were pleased to learn new vocabulary concerning the names of clothes in French, also to identify the names of the different jobs and occupations, as well as the objects of the class by referring to the pictures, which allowed us to understand our topics. We also learned the numbers from 20 to 50. Now we can read and pronounce the words well. We learned the singular and plural pronouns and their meanings in English. We can conjugate the verb to be "Être" in present tense. It's really fun to learn French by playing games and singing songs!

Year 5

In year 5 we are the stars

In French, this Term we have been identifying the name of some parts of the house, referring to the pictures and their meaning in English. We have also been learning about different School subjects and how to give our opinions about them using: I like, I dislike, in French; to conjugate verb to have"Avoir" with all pronouns singular and also to conjugate verb to play "jouer" in present tense. Now we can build a sample and correct sentences using pronouns. We can count by memory and pronounce the numbers from 30 to 60 very well.We used different strategies for our learning which is essentially based on education while playing which makes learning easier.

Year 6

In year 6 we are the stars

In French, this Term we have been learning to identify and describe the parts of the face and body using the verb 'to have"Avoir" with the singular and plural pronouns in a sample sentence. We also studied the names of the five senses and the verbs that associate with them. We can also say recognize directions and prepositions for objects. We learned how to conjugate regular verbs ending with **er** in present tense with all pronouns. We enjoyed counting from 20 to 70 in French. We did many enjoyable activities to suit the topic we were learning in Term 2!.

In English, we have studied how to produce explanations texts and biographies of famous people. In Mathematics, we have covered fractions, decimals and multiplication and division. In Science, we investigated electricity through experiments using conductors and insulators. In Topic, we have studied inventors and inventions that have changed the world.






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This term in mathematics we have been exploring famous mathematicians and the positive impact their studies have left behind. This has created discussions regarding future career paths for students.

It has been an interesting and exciting term within the English department. KS3 students have explored new skills and faced challenges with analysing and developing their understanding of texts.

Year 7's placed themselves in the shoes of Auggie Pullman with the book Wonder and spent some time comparing their own school life to the difficulties of the protagonist. We explored how challenges can be overcome by creating our own life mottos and precepts.

Year 8's have been on quite the Literature journey as they began the term by tapping into the story Tunnel Vision and ventured into the Horror Fiction Genre. They ended the term by diving into the theme of war and broadened their minds to the hardships faced by refugees.

Our Year 9's have started their iGCSE journey with the world famous play, An Inspector Calls. Students grasped an understanding of social class, responsibility and equality. smash Science

We have had another exciting term here in the Science Department at Newton Smash. Many Year 11 pupils have been diligently preparing for their IGCSE examinations, and all Science students have sat their mock examinations. Year 11 teachers have been using this valuable data to inform their teaching to address knowledge gaps and misconceptions in order to close these gaps. Some pupils have been making great progress as they continue to consolidate their learning from KS4.

Year 10 Biology students have been learning about various animal organ systems, nutrients and food tests. When learning about the circulatory system, some students had the opportunity to dissect an animal heart to identify structures and create a memorable learning experience.

Year 10 Chemistry students have been learning about inorganic chemistry. When learning about Group 1 elements, students experimented using them to observe their reactions with oxygen, dihydrogen monoxide, and dilute acids. When learning about gases of the atmosphere, pupils learned how to estimate the percentage of oxygen in the air and completed experiments to identify how carbon dioxide cycles around the atmosphere and through the Earth.



This term Year 7 pupils learned about ecology, separation techniques, and electricity. Year 8 pupils learned about fluids, light, and the reactions of metals. Some pupils had the opportunity to investigate how light reflects and refracts and how light behaves when it passes through coloured filters. Year 9 pupils learned about the reactivity series, electricity and various types of fields, and were introduced to IGCSE Chemistry syllabus.




