Have a fantastic, restful Winter break and we look forward to welcoming you back in the new year for a fresh start in 2022. Take care and have an enjoyable break!












In ICT, learning has been 'Gamified'. This means the student becomes more engaged with what they need to learn, through playing educational games..










Students working on their presentations using PowerPoint and learning through an online quiz.



SEN

The SEN (Special Educational Needs) Department of the school is the area that deals with students who are have challenges in their learning or barriers that prohibit them from achieving at the required standards. Throughout this term, we supported students in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

At the beginning, we were off to a slow start as there were limitations in term of how much contact that could be made due to Covid 19 restrictions. However as time progressed, we were able to apply interventions more, therefore helping in boosting students understanding through various targets that were set Individual Pupil Profile. It is our intention to apply more interventions in the next term so that children with special or in need to additional help can gain success through assistance from the SEN department.

Our EAL (English as an Additional Language) team provides interventions to children who require little more support with English. The team works alongside classroom teachers to help children develop English language skills, reading and learning strategies.



Therefore seeing all the children back in school has meant that quick progress in learning phonics, and understanding grammar has been achieved. We have worked hard to develop speaking skills through the use of phonics workshops and continue to sharpen comprehension skills aiding the children to answer questions on what they have just read to ensure understanding has been achieved.

During the sessions the children have shown enthusiasm and resilience and they immensely enjoyed their learning. Our team really appreciated the class teachers for their cooperation and parents for their ongoing support at home.

Celebrate your hardwork and we're looking forward to Spring term 2022.




Primary School Counsellor - Meadhbh Murphy




As Primary School Counsellor my role is to help children who are experiencing social or emotional difficulties, which can affect their academic performance in school and at home.




