Dear Parents,

I am sure that you will agree with me that this academic year has gone very quickly. It has been an unprecedented academic year quite like no other. This has been a year dominated by blended learning caused by the Covid-19 Pandemic. We have done our very best to minimize the impact to learning and ,yet, I am all sure that you will agree with me that there is no substitute to the students being in the classroom. However, the need to keep the children safe has been the overwhelming consideration and the many visits that we received form the Ministry of Health has confirmed that we uphold all the necessary precautions extremely well.

There have been students, parents and teachers who contracted the virus and I am very pleased to hear that they all made a swift recovery. I am delighted to say that the team were extremely impressed with all aspects of the school and we were awarded QNSA status. I am very proud of all the students, teachers and parents. The school will continue to grow and remain a centre of excellence for many years to come.

This year has also seen the first cohort of Year 11 undergo the Year 11 IGCSE examinations. These were sat under very challenging circumstances and, although we are still awaiting the final results, it appears that we will have a 100% success rate with some outstanding grades. I have worked within British education now for almost 30 years, and these results will be the most successful results that I have ever experienced, clearly well above outcomes in the United Kingdom. We have also started undergoing PUMA and PIRL tests for KG2 until Year 9. This is to check that learning is meeting the necessary standards in reading and mathematics throughout a child's development. It will also enable us to ensure that all our students meet the levels required to make substantive progress in years to come. This is just another example of how the school is investing in your child's development.


I again want to thank all our wonderful students for making this year so special and we look forward to seeing you all here again in August.

Key Stage 1 (Years One and Two)

In Year 3 this term, we have been looking at different types of measurements. We know how to measure the length, width and height of an object in mm, cm and metres, to measure the capacity of an object in Millilitres and litres and how much something weighs in KG and grams. We also learnt about time. In science, we have learnt about magnets and how they work in our everyday life. We have created magnetic games to show what we have learnt. In history and geography, we have been researching and exploring different countries around the world.

In Year 4, we have been on a time travel adventure to the Victorian era. We have enjoyed learning about the role of a child during this time. We learnt about education, toys and how the children use to work!! We have been writing diaries in English from the perspective of a time traveler in the Victorian era. In science, we have been looking at electricity. We have learnt about creating electric circuits and what a current is. We have also learnt how to measure electricity and the importance of safety around electrical items. In geography, we have been looking at world maps. We were learning key terminology used to describe some of Earths features. We have learnt what hemispheres we live in and what the differences are between North and South.

In Year 5, we have studied ancient Greece and how their early society compares to the world today. We have learnt about some of their famous schoolers and their influence on the world. We have created plays with scripts to reenact some of the great moments in ancient Greece. In science, we have studied plants, recapping on our previous knowledge and extending our understanding of pollination and the growth of plants in unusual climates. We have also learnt about animal habitats and explain why some animals will live in one part but not the other.

In Year 6, we have studied Crime and Punishment, looking at what happened at the beginning of the 19th century. We have studied some of the crimes and what punishments fell upon them compared to what happens today. In mathematics, we have been studying 3D shapes, calculating perimeters and diameters. In science, we have been creating electrical circuits to make bells ring and lights flash. We have been creating diagrams of our circuits, learning about the symbols used to create them.

Key Stage 4 (Years 10 & 11)

This term, we have created history in Newton British School Muraikh with our first cohort of Year 11 students completing their IGCSE courses. The students have been resilient throughout this term by adapting to the changing circumstances regarding their IGCSE examinations. Students have completed their internal examinations for both Cambridge and Pearson and we eagerly await their IGCSE results on the 12th August to celebrate their success.

Year 10 and Year 11 students have been fully engaging with their online lessons during this term. Teachers have ensured our students continue to receive a high quality education delivering online lessons via Zoom. Teachers have also ensured that all lessons were recorded and placed on our Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) alongside lesson resources so students can access the information outside of the lesson. The attendance and engagement of lessons has been very good across Key Stage 4. So well done everyone!

Our Year 10 students are currently preparing for their end of term examinations. Students have been issued their personal examination timetable with their revision guide to prepare effectively for their examinations. We welcomed back our students on the 30th May 2021 which was a great moment for both students and teachers. Students have the opportunity for full time face- to- face learning to support their progress in each academic subject.

Finally, I want to say how proud I am of our Key Stage 4 students. They have faced challenges throughout this academic year whilst doing their IGCSE examinations and they overcame challenges with resilience and determination.

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The Arabic Department and Islamic Studies at Newton British School (Muraikh) undertook many achievements, competitions and activities during the academic year 2020/2021, despite the challenges related to the Covid-19 pandemic. There have been competitions such as:

- The 'Academic Competition' between Years 4, 5 and 6. These competitions aim to spread the spirit of competition amongst students and encourage their capacity to absorb the language.
- The 'Knight of Arabic hand writing Competition': This competition encouraged students to show their talent for hand writing and writing in general.
- The 'Creativity competition' (for all Newton campuses): This competition encouraged students to nurture and develop their talents in the fields of Arabic singing, poetry recitation and oratory. The school won first place in singing and poetic recitation for Secondary students, and second place in recitation for the Primary students.
- 'Al Muhaddith Al Sagheer' Competition. This competition was held for our students and we are still awaiting the results.
- The 'Preacher competition' which was for middle and high school students. This competition aimed to encourage students to recite and follow the best techniques to persuade the recipient of different viewpoints.

The Arabic teachers seek to provide students with enrichment and development strategies to all students in the various fields of the Arabic language.

We also took pride in promoting the 'Take my hand teachers project'. This project aims to assist students who need support and communicate with them individually and personally as well as supporting parents. As a result, we have seen effective student progress and an improvement in their academic levels and Arabic language magazines, especially reading and writing.

As a school, we have celebrated the International Day of the Arabic Language and also the National Day of the State of Qatar. We always seek to promote national identity, Islamic culture and religious values. We promote them during school lessons, whether through various strategies or classroom activities.

Also during this term, congratulations and blessings were sent on the occasion of the holy month of Ramadan, and some photos and videos were shared for students' celebrations of the advent of the holy month.
