





In English, we have been learning the story of Zog.


We learnt the story using actions and changed the characters to create our very own story!












Year 5 have had a great Term 2 filled with lots of fun and interesting activities!



Science week was a week of experiments



It is wonderful to see the collaboration between the school and parents.














## SPORTS DAYS








## SCHOOL TRIPS

Our beginners focused on learning the basic adaptation to the water, water confidence, body positions and forms of propulsion through the water.


Our intermediate and advanced swimmers focused on learning the global movements of Freestyle, Backstroke, Breaststroke and Butterfly while

We can't wait for term 3! Well done everyone!














# FRENCH

### Year 4

This term, students learnt about food and drinks.
