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### **iGCSE** and A level Study Conduct Policy

#### iGCSE course at NIA

Year 10 and 11 students follow the iGCSE study programme at NIA Secondary. Besides Mathematics and English which are compulsory subjects they iGCSE students must select from 7 options from the current option blocks.

If year 10 and 11 students are struggling with the volume of work however, there is an option for them to drop some of their subjects (not more than 3). This process can take place at any point of the academic year; student must obtain a parental written permission and an SMT approval. Where possible students will 'double up' on a subject which they already study in another option block. If this is not available then student is still required to attend all classes and be registered, however student then works independently in the back of the class, not participating in the subject they dropped.

In Year 10, summative assessment takes place at the end of each term and students' progress is reported on three times a year. In Year 11, summative assessment takes place at the end of October, November, December and the start of January and in March via Mock examinations which are compulsory for all students. The results are reported on to parents after each Mock.

Some of Year 10 students may sit their iGCSE exams in Year 10 at NIA Secondary. This is called a <u>Fast track programme</u> and only students with an A\*- B (9-6) grade in the subject who achieve a minimum of 60% in December/January Mock exams can apply. Students who opt for fast track in Year 10 and with to sit 3-4 iGCSE exams at the end of Year 10 may have a reduced timetable to only 5 subjects in year 10 and then 4 subjects in total of which 3-4 are different subjects in year 11.

Year 11, 12 and 13 students may register for iGCSE exams in October, January and May/June also for fast track or resit purposes.

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At NIA we wish to motivate students to maintain highest possible standards at all times, however as the final year of the iGCSE course is very crucial, Year 11 and 12 students are placed on a contract where they are made aware of their duties and responsibilities and the consequence should they not observe these:

- Attend all lessons: if your attendance in a subject falls below 80%, including unauthorised absences, as a consequence of lateness in each Term, you will not being registered for iGCSE or AS/A2 examinations at NIA Secondary in accordance with the MOE guidelines, or you will be unregistered if the registration already has taken place, without any reimbursement of the registration fees (attendance will be recorded up to the first examination in the May/June series when students will start their study leave. Students may miss 1 day prior to their exam). Attendance will be recorded in each subject separately.
- Arrive to all lessons punctually (3 lates will count as 1 unauthorised absence).
- Attend designated Year 11 and 12 Mock examinations on Saturdays and during the school week, extra tutoring sessions, assemblies, and seminars. Students absent for October and November Mock examinations (except for serious medical or other reasons) will be graded a U in each exam they miss. Students absent for December/January Mock examination will not be issued with predicted grades.
- <u>Complete all tasks</u> and adhere to the published dates on the Academic Calendar for the <u>completion of coursework</u>. Collect stamps each day.
- Maintain high study conduct students will only be registered for AS exams at NIA in subjects which they pass in Mock 3 exam (achieve A\*-E grade, 9-3 grade as applicable), not the subjects they fail (receive F-U grade or 2-1 as applicable). This does not include the core subjects Maths and English.
- Abide by the School Dress Code.
- Have a positive work ethic and arrive at each lesson fully prepared with the correct equipment.
- Respect others' right to learn in lessons and when using other school facilities (e.g. Library, Study Room) and never adversely affect the learning of others.
- Understand that study periods are built into the timetable to assist with the demands of the courses and should be used for coursework, presentations or preparation for assessments and examinations.
- Abide by the guidelines given by the school Code of Conduct and the Student Handbook.

If the points above are not observed, it may lead towards further disciplinary procedures and sanctions such as no registration for/deregistration from iGCSE or AS/A2 examinations at NIA (all subject with the exception of Maths and English) and result in proceedings towards permanent exclusion or not being reenrolled into the next academic year.

After a conclusion has been made about student not being registered for an exam(s) at NIA Secondary, the student in question may appeal via YEAR 11 and 12 CONTRACT EXEMPTION REQUEST form to the SMT where a collective decision is made on case by case basis, where the student's effort, behaviour, attitude towards learning, attendance and Mock 1 and 3 results will be taken into consideration together with January modules grades. SMT will consult the student's subject teacher and Head of Department before







they make the final decision. After a successful appeal takes place, students may be registered at NIA for double/triple fees as applicable based on the date.

In order to progress from Year 11 into Year 12 students must obtain a minimum 5 iGCSE subjects A\*-C or 9-4. In some cases students with 5 iGCSEs A\*-D and 9-3 may be conditionally accepted into Year 12 at NIA, however these students must sign an additional contract which stipulates further responsibilities which include to successfully resit their iGCSE examinations. The target as per the MOE is for Year 11 students to achieve a minimum of 7 iGCSEs A\*-D or 9-3 so they can then progress onto 3 AS courses (or 1 A level and 1 AS); however it is also possible for students with 5 iGCSEs A\*-D or 9-3 to progress into year 12, however they must then study 4 AS courses or 1A level and 2 other AS subjects.

Students who do not achieve 5 iGCSE A\*-D or 9-3 cannot be promoted into Year 12 at NIA and should they wish to stay they must repeat Year 11.

#### A level course at NIA

Our Sixth Form Programme is based around the first and second year of A-levels which we believe promote the best basis for higher education. Courses for Year 12 are known as AS (Advanced Subsidiary) or IAS (International Advanced Subsidiary) and Year 13 as A2.

#### In Year 12 students are expected:

• to study **FOUR** subjects at AS Level. These will be completed in the Summer of Year 12. Each AS will count as being equivalent to half of a full A Level.

Some students may leave directly after Year 12 with their AS qualifications whilst others will continue.

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#### In Year 13 students are expected:

• to study THREE subjects at A2 Level (you may only select a subject which you studied and passed at AS Level. A2 Level will count as the other half of a full A level.

All Year 12 and 13 students are placed on a contract with outline duties and responsibilities above.

The is an option for all Year 12 and 13 students to follow **individual study plans** where they can combine iGCSE resits, IAS and IAL courses in one year including self-study of a maximum of two subjects as per their needs. Parental permission and SMT consultation is necessary for this process (please note that year 11 students are not allowed to fast track AS courses in year 11 as students are not allowed to jump from one Key stage to another. Fast track is only possible within KS4 and within KS5).
