He also gave tips on how to succeed at university and potentially obtain a sports scholarship and answered any questions students might have.



Year 12 and Year 13 students had the opportunity to hear from a Child Life Specialist who works at Sidra hospital. Cara Smith explained what her job entails and the impact she may have on children.

She explained that Child Life Specialists lead the effort to provide developmental, psychosocial, and emotional support to children and families in the hospital. They are trained in child and adolescent development to design and implement interventions that help patients cope with hospitalization and illness. These interventions include developmentally appropriate preparation and education, procedural support, and a wide range of therapeutic and expressive activities.

She also gave students an overview of the different career paths the degree of Psychology could lead to and how the Qatari government was investing more and more into the mental well-being of children.

Our active student council members have launched calls for donations to help provide shelter and relief to the people affected by the earthquake. They have raised more than QAR7000 and made sure the money reached the affected areas through Qatar Charity.


Our student council members have been thinking about ways to make our school more environmentally friendly. They planted new seeds in the garden, and looked after the plants by watering them.

SCIENCE WILLIAM SCIENCE SWIFE TO SCIENCE SCIEN



Here students were able to learn about several different factors that have influenced Qatar's development and the discovery of gas and oil. Focusing on the examples of natural resources is an excellent resource for understanding rapid development and urbanization. Urbanization will be the focus of our studies in Term 3.






The students took part in two fieldwork studies for their IGCSE Geography course. The first of their fieldwork took place in Msherib, it was a study of how Old Msherib and New Msherib land use changes. The students carried out different urban studies on the two areas before comparing their results and findings.

The second of their fieldwork studies took part in Al Wakra beach near the Souq. The students carried out a beach study here along different parts of the coastline. They collected data on the beach profile and sediment before making their own field sketches. Well done guys on successful fieldwork trips!


Every first week in January, The French Department celebrates la galette des rois by sharing almond pies and doing fun activities.


