The children learned actions for both stories. They have done an amazing job using the story map we made to retell the stories with their Children friends. have also been encouraged to write words and draw pictures about the stories during the Literacy lessons.

Phonics

We have worked so hard in our Phonics lessons. We have learned so many new letter sounds with help from our Jolly Phonics songs.

Philosophy for Children

We have been exploring philosophical thinking during our P4C lessons. We are working on being caring, creative, critical, and collaborative thinkers. We explored 'big ideas' like respect, responsibility, happiness, friendship and celebrations. Children were encouraged to justify their answers by giving examples, agreeing and disagreeing respectfully with their friends.

Term 1: French Newsletter

Year 3

In year 3 we are the stars

We have learnt how to pronounce the alphabet in French which allowed us to understand French phonics system, then we focused on numbers from 1 to 10 and we looked at the aspects of how to greet and introduce ourselves in French. Students also enjoyed learning colours, and singing songs to help them remember what we have learnt.

Year 4

In year 4 we are the stars

In French, we have enjoyed learning about the days of the week, the months of the year and how to identify and recognise the weather for four seasons. We worked on the numbers from 1 to 40 with help of songs as it is more fun to learn French through playing games and singing. Students started understanding the usefulness of syllables when reading in French.

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Year 5

In year 5 we are the stars

In French, we revisited greetings and cardinal numbers from 1-40 as well as how to tell time in French. We looked at names for family members and the use of verb 'avoir' within the context. Students learnt the French possessive pronouns. We worked on adjectives of colour and how to adapt them when describing masculine and feminine nouns. Students reviewed the names of days of the week in French.

Year 6

In year 6 we are the stars

In French, we have been learning how to greet and introduce ourselves and how to count to 50. Students worked on the days of the week and months to be able to say their date of birth. Students enjoyed learning classroom instructions and acting them out. This created a lot of enthusiasm and engagement from the students. I was really happy to see many of them willing to stand in front of the class to perform the simple act for words like 'écoutez''. Students work on conjugation of simple -er verbs in all paradigms.




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Anti bullying week and World Kindness Day




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Science week
